Others among the Blues' walking-wounded were rugged defender Trevor Sims, who had stitches in a cut above an eye, and vice-captain Neil Craig who completed the game with a corked thigh.

The injuries were a real shock to Sturt, which must now face its build-up to the finals with restricted playing staff.

South Adelaide, too, incurred a long injury list on its way to beating West Adelaide.

Captain Geoff Baynes broke his nose, Wayne Slattery pulled a hamstring, rover Phil Collins suffered severe bruising of the leg he badly injured early in the season,

Glenelg 15-14, Sturt 14-12

Glenelg stole a sensational victory over Sturt in the time-on period of a nail-biting last quarter at Football Park yesterday.

The Tigers, facing an 11 point deficit and a blustering head-on wind change. the last launched an all-out blitz on the Blues.

It appeared Sturt would be able to resist the challenge, but a crippling list of injuries took its toll in the dying minutes.

At the 26-minute mark, with Sturt almost on its knees with key players out-of-action, Glenelg hit the front with a goal to half-forward Stephen Copping.

The explosive Copping repeated the effort seconds before the siren and the Tigers inflicted a serious blow to Sturt's efforts to stay in the finals race.

The injuries on Sturt's better players of the day undoubtedly gave Tigers an edge as both sides slowed almost to a walk in the heavy conditions.

Ill - fated captain Brendon Howard was taken to the Queen Elizabeth hospital for surgery on a dislocated shoulder; Peter Friedrichs was undergoing x-rays last night for a shoulder injury; Trevor Sims needed stitches for a cut over his eye and vice-captain Neil Craig finished the game with a corked thigh.

Glenelg pounced to an early break, out-scoring Sturt by 26 points in the first quarter.

The absolute gloom of the Sturt rooms after the game was in stark contrast to the nervous joy in the Glenelg quarters.

Relieved Tiger coach John Halbert said it was Weston who was a major force in the side's fightbacks late in the third and final quarters.
