# Tigers reaffirm right to lead

Glenelg powered its way to an impressive 45-point win over North Adelaide at Football Park yesterday to reaffirm its right to top spot on the premiership ladder.

And as North struggled to stay in touch its coach and No. 1 rover Mike Nunan was being wheeled into hospital for X-rays following a violent but legitimate clash with Glenelg's Graham Cornes nine minutes into the first quarter.

That North Adelaide should ultimately lose the game was predictable to the students of North's recent history.

Nunan has missed seven games (yesterday was eight) this season because of injury and North has won only two of those -Torrens at Prospect and Woodville at Football Park.

Without him again yesterday it was struggling for most of the game. In the second half it was never going to win.
