Norwood catapulted itself closer towards another grand final with a stunning performance against Glenelg at Football Park yesterday.

It was not just the fact that it beat the top side. It was the way the Redlegs did it.

They were ruthless, relentless and showed the character of a champion side.

What made Norwood look even better was a faint-hearted final quarter Glenelg, when kicked only three points.

Glenelg had matched Norwood for three quarters to trail by only two points at the last change, but when desperation and running legs were heeded, it was powerless.

The Tigers averaged a miserable two kicks per player in the final term and looked anything but premiership material during that time.

Nine of Glenelg's 'stars" - Graham Cornes, Michael Farquhar, Peter McInerney, Fred Phillis, Ralph Sewer, Paul Weston, Peter Brown, Neville Caldwell and Peter Carey - collected a mere 11 kicks between them in the last quarter.
