A battered Norwood was licking its wounds and pride after being pulverised by Port Adelaide record before a Football crowd at Park yesterday.

The Redlegs will lose four players for the elimination battle with West Adelaide on Saturday, while David Granger is in doubt for Port for qualifying final against South on Sunday.

The Redlegs injured were Peter Laughlin who will miss three matches with an ankle injury. Robert Barton who will miss at least one match also with an ankle injury, while Paul Adler John Gallagher could each miss two with hamstring complaints.

Granger has a strained right elbow and was considered doubtful.

Port's 46-point victory, despite woeful kicking for goal, has seen it as Glenelg's strongest challenger for the flag.

In a thrilling last round which attracted 57,462 people, West held its fifth spot with a surprise win over South at Richmon 1. while Sture scored a gallant victory over Glenelg at Adelaide.
