Bays hit by shock waves

NORWOOD, the unwilling underdog completed the biggest shock of yesterday's round of league football with a convincing victory over Glenelg.

The Redlegs turned the tide against Glenelg in a ruthless hunt for conquest over the Tigers and finally won by 22 points.

The only real solace for Glenelg was the brilliant roving effort of Tony McGuinness, who further warranted serious consideration for his State debut against WA here next Saturday.

Port Adelaide easily brushed aside a troubled South Adelaide, but the

legacy of that win was ankle injury worries to David Granger and Michael Errey.

Sturt continued on its devastating way with a 78 point drubbing of North Adelaide at Football Park.

The Roosters never looked a threat against the league leaders as big Rick Davies continued his excellent form with six goals on top of his eight goals last week.

State squad ruckman Frank Spiel caused some concern when he left the

ground with an ankle injury, but it was not serious.

Woodville got to within two points of West Torrens in the third term before failing by only 14 points to achieve its first victory of the season.

It was the second successive week in which Woodville has shown a marked improvement, but coach Rod Olsson declined to comment because of Press reports about the club during the week.

HOT REDLEGS GO ON PARADE

Young brigade comes of age

Never say the Redlegs are beaten before a big game at the Parade . . . that was one of the lessons handed to Glenelg yesterday.

Norwood simply showed too much character for the Tigers.

And that's despite being down on its top form over previous weeks, playing on the Wednesday night and missing stars like Michael Aish, Phil Gallagher, Frank Stemper and Paul Adler.

The odds were against Norwood but it turned them in its favor with relentless fight for the hard ball and earned an impressive 22-point win.

Theories that Norwood would run out of legs because of the Escort Cup match were unfounded and as the match wore on, the harder it ran for the ball.

It was an exciting, pressure-packed match and the Redlegs again showed they would be worthy competitors at Football Park in September.

Norwood's best player list was like an encyclopedia. Neville Roberts for his desperation and ability to find team-mates, Jim Thiel who was rock-solid in defence, rover Greg Turbill who worked tirelessly around the packs, and wingman Danny Jenkins for his drive.

But perhaps the most pleasing features were the superb performances of youngsters Greg Thomas, and Duncan Fosdike, and the great promise shown by John Hall and Dean Renfrey.

The big clash between Brento Hartfield at his old club proved a "fizzer" — there was no contest.

He was under severe pressure and managed only four kicks.

Taking nothing away from the Redlegs, Glenelg did suffer setbacks with umpiring decisions at crucial stages.

The most remarkable was when Peter Carey took a mark in the last term, walked back to take his kick and had the ball knocked out of his arms by an opponent.

The umpire thought he handballed, called play-on and Norwood tood advantage and snapped a goal.

It happened early in the last term and the incident and the pressure Norwood applied stunned the Tigers.

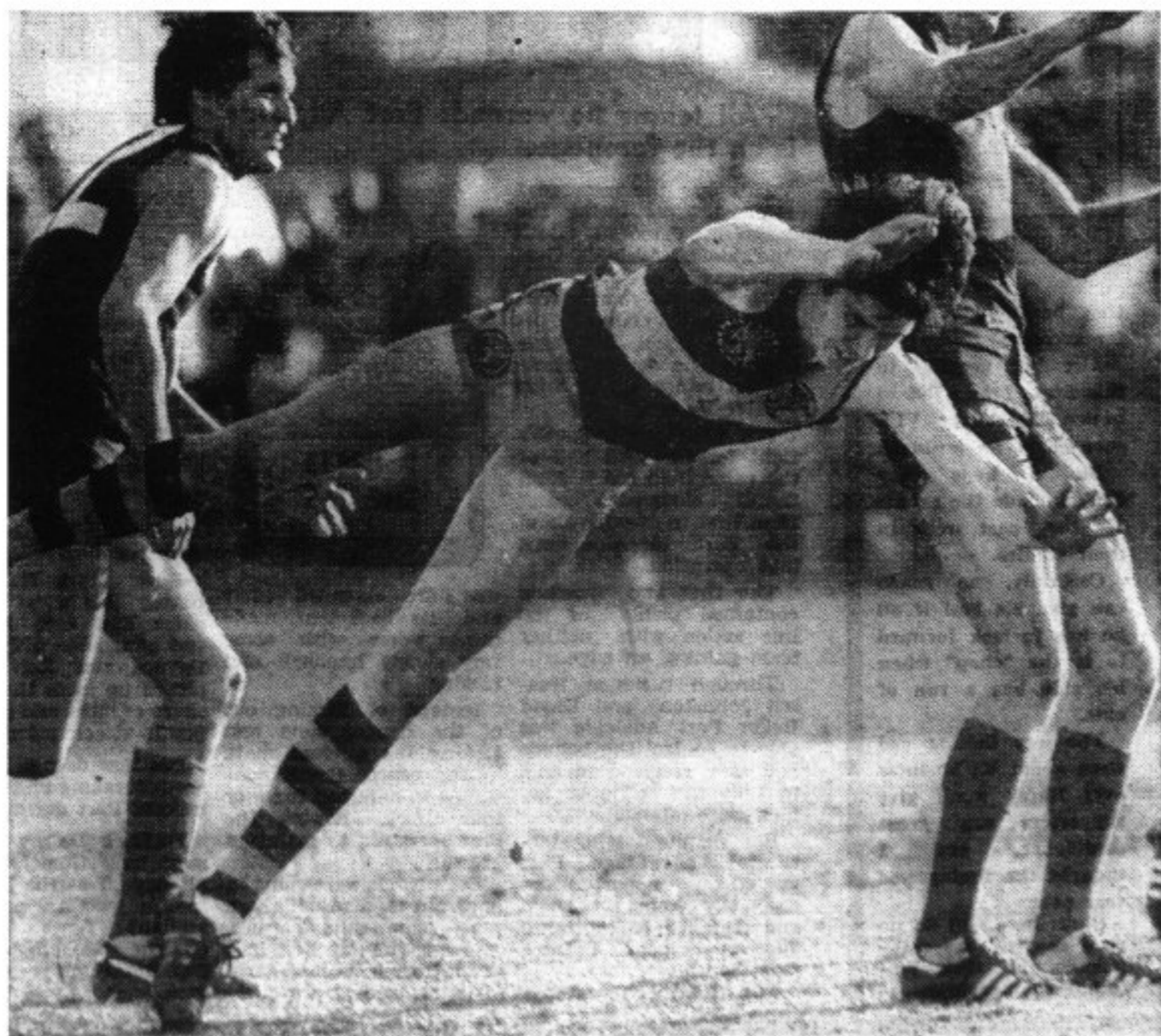
