Glenelg's winning margin looked comfortable enough and the two premierships were gratefully received, but there was little joy in evidence at Glenelg Oval after yesterday's disposal of South Adelaide.

Everyone except the South Adelaide camp seemed more concerned about Glenelg's lack-lustre second half.

A contest that had been set up by a convincing first half for a cakewalk celebration of veteran Graham Cornes's 300th game became an anxious struggle in the most uncomfortably wintry conditions of the season.

Coach John Halbert was not pleased by Glenelg's second-half fumbles.

"We made too many mistakes. We just could not get anything going after half-time," he said.

What caused the turnaround? Was it South Adelaide's now famous "night eyes" that enabled it to hit back strongly in the chilling murk that descended after half-time? Or did Glenelg drop the bit?

Whatever the reason, South outscored Glenelg 10.6 to 8.5 in the last two quarters and may have crept even closer but for some costly defensive errors.

South had only two good players in the first half — ace rover Mark Naley and ruckman Robb Hawkins — as Glenelg cruised smoothly to a 40-point lead.

Glenelg, on the other hand, had plenty. Ralph Sewer was punishingly constructive in the centre, Michael Lunniss and David Holst dominated their half-forward flanks, Peter Maynard and Paul Weston gave the South forwards

strictly limited chances and Stephen Kernahan quickly became a big-man problem for the opposition.

But things turned sour for Glenelg in the second half.

South players who had scarcely been sighted in the first half jumped into the game strongly to harass and embarrass their opponents as they matched goal for goal against the wind and rain.

Not a real threat

Most notable improvers were centreman Michael Bennett, half-forward Michael Irvine and big forward Wayne Carty, while Naley, making light of his third demanding game in six days, continued to menace the Glenelg defence with his lightning penetration.

But, despite four second-half goals from Carty, South was never able to build quite enough momentum as it drove home with the wind to seriously threaten to snatch the game.
