Some mothers would cringe

Footballers ... some mothers do 'av 'em; but at Thebarton Oval yesterday - Mothers' Day - most of those mothers would have been embarrassed.

Not so much the Glenelg mothers; although a few of them would have felt uncomfortable. No, it was the mothers of many of the Torrens players who spent a very sad day at Thebarton Oval.

Glenelg won comfortably by 54 points. But it was an ordinary performance against a less than ordinary opponent in a very ordinary game.

Glenelg's Tony McGuiness again showed what a fine young player he is and in the process exposed one of Torrens's most obvious problems - the roving.

He, fellow rover John Paynter and Michael Lunniss were a constant irritation for Torrens despite a fair-dinkum effort by Ian Hewett, who made the most of his chances.

Many of them were provided for him by Dirk Inglis, who again gave Torrens a strong four quarters. He was a credit to his Mum.

So was Stephen Kernahan, either at full forward or in ruck, where he and Peter Carey (who survived the game) provided a lot of the drive for Glenelg's success.

Torrens was given a chance to win the match by some disciplined games by some of the side's younger players.

Coach Glenn Elliott had done his homework; figured Paul Weston, Ralph Sewer, Graham Cornes and Chris McDermott would be problems; thought if he could stop them, Torrens would have a chance.

And it might have worked. Ian Hanna reduced Weston's influence to a mere trickle, Sean Buckley hardly allowed Sewer a kick, Greg Flanagan sabotaged Cornes and Mark Downie did a good job on McDermott.

But it was the older Torrens players who let the side down.

The most disappointing was Rod Galt. His effort in attack was pathetic consid-

ering the enormous skills he possesses. Shane Grambeau never caused Glenelg any concern and Peter Phillipou must be worried by his own form.

Had those three skilled and senior players got close to what they can do, Torrens might have upset Glenelg.

But Glenelg appeared to try as hard as it had to. Under pressure there are enough good players in the side to get it through most crises.

And had Torrens threatened it seriously, it almost certainly would have coped with the threat.
