# Redlegs the hunt

The Tigers yesterday ended their desperate hunt for premiiership points when they devoured a lame Norwood in the last quarter to snatch a 20-point victory at the Bay.

They bled themselves of every ounce of courage in a magnificent and successful comeback when they looked beaten in the third term.

And the greatest hero was Stephen Kernahan, who soared above the packs and stimulated Glenelg when it was in trouble.

### Delay

Glenelg did not look a sure winner until late in the last quarter, but the delay could only be seen as testament to Norwood's resilience,

The Redlegs were in strife at three-quarter time, Michael Aish was finally forced off with a corked thigh, and then John Hall (ankle) and Duncan Fosdike (hamstring) were injured and left them with only 17 fit men.

It was then that Glenelg coach Graham Cornes made a winning move. He put the fresh legs of John MacFarlane and Mark Motlop on the field and took off Alan Gavan and Stringer Walsh.

The pendulum swung Glenelg's way. It was full of running, indeed full of hunger for victory after four successive losses.

In contrast, Norwood was struggling. It had too many forwards down on form on the day and was kept alive by deadly accuracy for goal.

Cornes attributed the win to Glenelg's good players across centre and in the forward lines.

Then he added the defenders, ruckmen, and interchange players to the list. That left only the ball steward and the boot sprigger not to get a mention.

But he was right. Glenelg did not have a player who failed to contribute.

In contrast, too many of Norwood's regular stars failed to shine. Neville Roberts, despite his three goals, was well held by Tony Hall, Tom Warhurst contain struggled to John Seebohm, while Aish faded after he was injured.

It was players of the calibre of the gutsy Garry McIntosh, and the determined Justin Scanlon and Michael Taylor who kept Norwood in the hunt.

The Tigers had a galaxy of stars, headed by Stephen Kernahan at centre half-forward. He finished with 17 kicks, eight marks, five handballs and three goals.

And each one of those marks was fantastic. which prompted Cornes to say: "He did not take marks, he took the impossible marks."

The goals came early in the last quarter to put the Tigers in front.

Peter Maynard was damaging across halfforward and on the ball, setting up plenty of opportunities for teammates.

Michael Murphy showed greater maturity as a player at centre half-back and time after time rebounded the wayward and unco-ordinated Norwood attacks.

He received magnificent support from nearby teammates including Wayne Stringer, Scott Salisbury and Hall.

Peter Carey, in his return from injury, did not dominate, but was an effective player in ruck and around the ground.

consistently Glenelg won the ball away from the packs, but its most obvious strength was in the air.

The Tigers -clutching paws snared 71 marks, while Norwood held only 49.


Norwood deserves praise for its accuracy for goal, but it is interesting to note that eight of the 16 goals came from marks, four from free kicks, and one from Roberts, which dribbled through and did more turns than a snake.\*

## Desperate

The umpires received their usual criticism from supporters. Glenelg had five more free kicks, including 12 to six in the last quarter.

But most of them were justified. Norwood often paid the price for poor checking and being slow off the mark, and on many occasions acted with frustration.

Norwood's best effort came in the third term, booting 9-1 to 4-0. There was a general improvement in its attack on the ball, players seemed more desperate, and they suddenly moved the ball better.
