# AT LAST! GLENELG IS BACK AND RUNNING

Glenelg shrugged off the memory of recent patchy performances by ruthlessly crushing a demoralised South Adelaide by a huge margin of 112 points at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

South may care to reflect that the gap could have been even worse had Glenelg not hit the goalpost on five occasions which might be some sort of a record.

It was a game vital to both team's chances of competing in the major round, but on their play over the last two weeks South may do well to avoid the wooden spoon.

Certainly their players floated like butterflies, but it was Glenelg who provided the sting.

The Tigers took the field without Denis Marshall with David Kernahan coming into the team on a wing which he made his own throughout.

### Wholesome

Peter Carey and Ross Gibbs warmed the interchange bench, but given their chance during the game they played prominently and added spice to an already wholesome flavor.

Glenelg made a lie of the term "football" by giving one of the most

skintilating exhibitions of handball it has ever been my privilege of watching.

South must have been impressed as well, because for the most part they just stood and watched as their opponents ran rings around them.

South coach Rick Davies took himself from the field midway through the second term to have a look at the game from the sidelines.

I dare say it looked no better than it did from the pressbox as the Panthers wilted under the heavy artillery that was fired at them by their purposeful, skillful, thoughtful and abundantly more talented opponents.

It is easy to play football when you are given the ball in space and have unlimited time in which to dispose of it accurately and to advantage.

South were "killed" on the scoreboard, and as one would expect, in statistics as well.

Glenelg hand passed on fewer than 197 occasions to South's 93 with a success rate of 99 per cent.

Some of the movements out of defence were superb, and usually finished off by one of the many running players who gave Glenelg unlimited scoring avenues.

South, with Davies and John Schneebichler held almost kickless by Max Kruse and Michael Murphy, had little option but to work around the flanks and found no joy in this approach.

The usually taciturn Glenelg coach Graham Cornes was all smiles at the end of the game as he and his co-selectors endeavored to sort out their best players.

It was a daunting task, but Tony Hall is tremendously talented and he was rarely out of the action.

The big mark, the deft handball, the timely goal are facets of his play which can lift others around him.

Craig Woodlands always appears to have time to balance himself and this was reflected on the scoreboard by six goals without a miss, and he was ably supported by Gibbs and Robin Kidney.

Murphy was a strong rebounding player in a team that had no passengers.

The other side of the picture was all gloom with Davies in a huddle with Bob Shearman looking as if they had just lost their last chip in the casino.

The bank balance is looking pretty desperate with half the team desperately out of form and bankrupt in confidence.

The options from the reserves offer little, and Davies, a proud man who has been a winner all his life, is on the brink of despair.

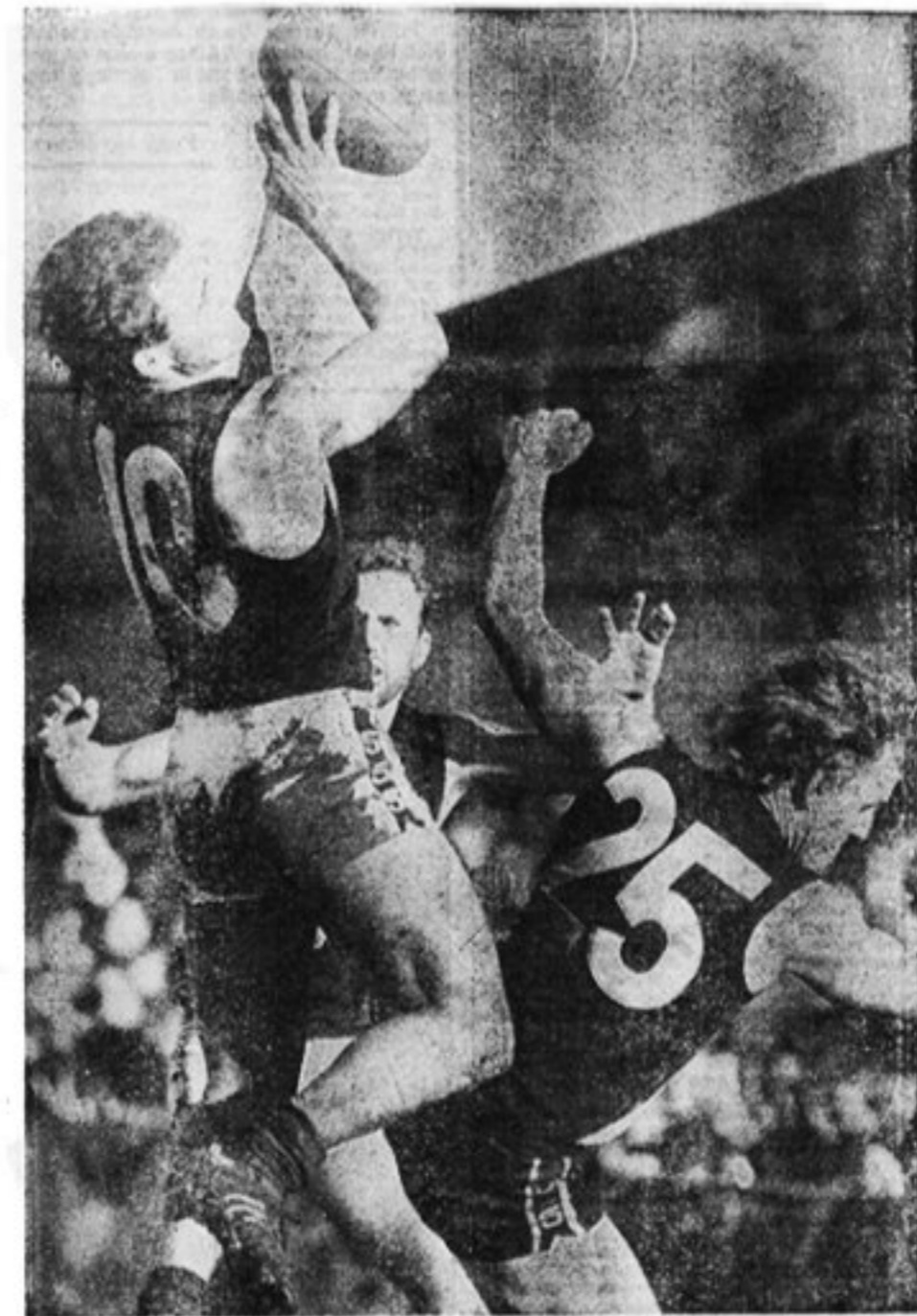
### Redundancy
