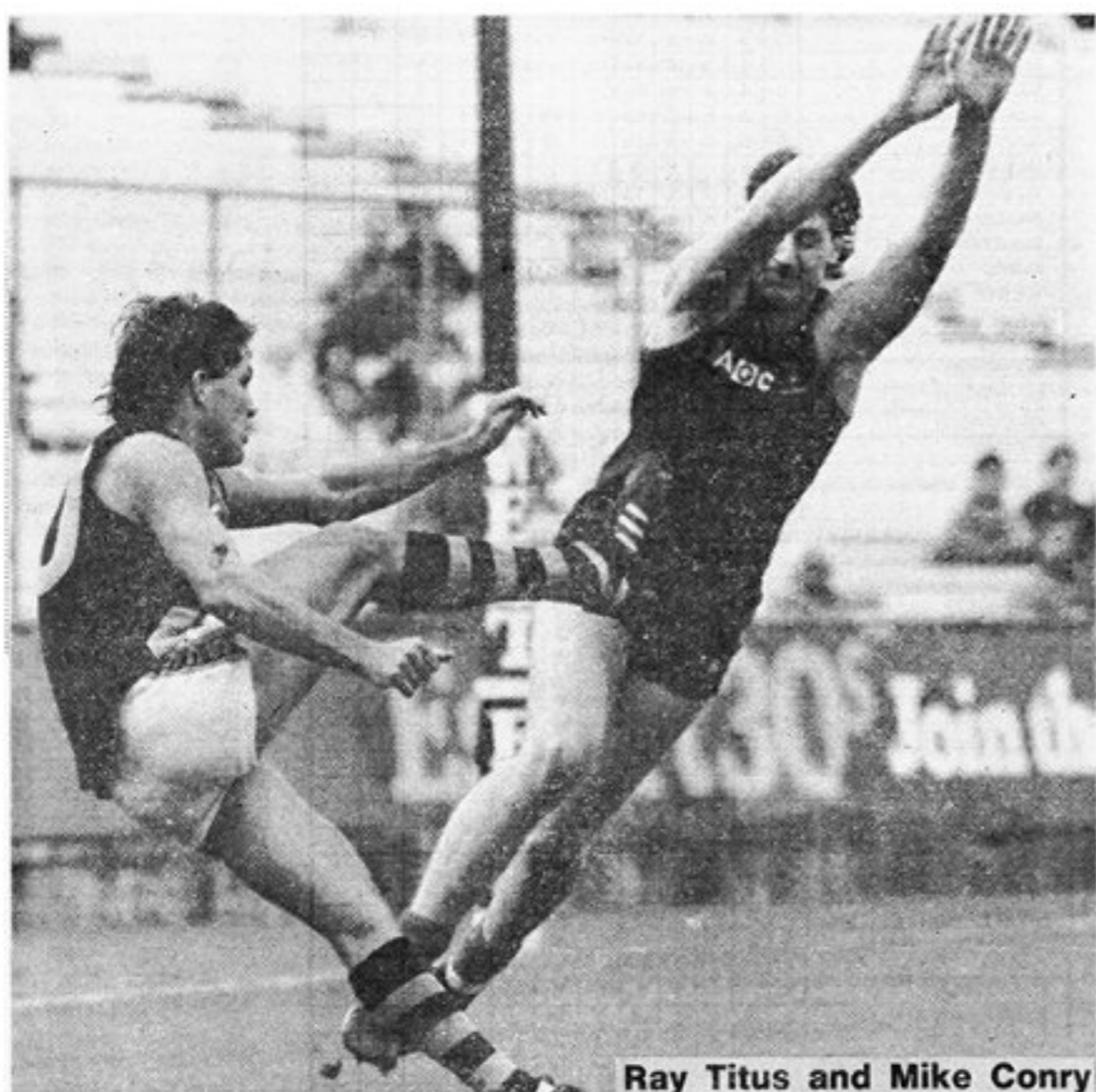


Bays: We're back

Approaching round 10 of the 1986 season, eventual premier Glenelg was struggling in seventh place.

It had won only three games, and went into its clash against third-placed Norwood as rank outsiders.

History now shows the game proved to be the turning point for the Tigers, defeating the Redlegs, and going on to win 12 of their next 16 games to take out the '86 premiership.

In the aftermath of the Glenelg-Norwood clash at Football Park yesterday, an eerie question was on the lips of 10,622 stunned supporters.

"Could history repeat itself?"

The Tigers, after winning only four of their first nine games, had systematically destroyed an inept Norwood to leap into the final five.

It was a performance which oozed class and confidence, and one which confirmed Glenelg as a legitimate premiership contender.

From the first bounce it outran, outthought and outscored its depleted opponent to charge to a 100-point victory.

Norwood's performance was not one of a premiership aspirant, and it appears a staggering list of crucial injuries finally has taken its toll.

It had no answer to Glenelg's running game, and was torn apart by prolific possession winners David Marshall, Peter Maynard, Scott Salisbury and David Kernahan.

And lion-hearted ruckman Peter Carey again asserted a significant influence on the game.

While matching his young opponent John Hall in ruck, his work around the ground was invaluable.

He belied his age and hefty 193cm frame to outmanoeuvre and evade many of his younger, quicker rivals.

Chris McDermott, by his high standards, had a relatively quiet day, but his 12 kicks, 17 handballs and

uncompromising defenders who thwarted many Norwood thrusts and set up countless others for their side.

Murphy, in particular, was in superb touch. In possibly his best game for the club, he pulled down 12 marks and had 20 disposals from centre half-back.

He was ably flanked by Stringer whose tireless rebound game was invaluable.

Glenelg still has plenty to prove before it is recognised as a genuine threat.

Its opposition yesterday appeared soft, lethargic and its good performers were hard to find.

Follower Stephen Richardson, centreman Garry McIntosh and veteran back pocket Michael Taylor all performed creditably.

three goals were extremely damaging.

Up forward - a problem area for the Bays all season - Glenelg had two reliable focal points in John Seebomh and rookie Craig Budarick.

They dominated aerial duels and around the packs to boot 10 goals between and completely outplay their Norwood opponents.
