IT'S OVER FOR JERRY

Norwood wingman Jerry D'Antiochia is expected to miss the rest of the season because of a left knee injury.

He suffered cruciate ligament damage after only two minutes of play in the match against Sturt at Football Park.

The injury marred a 43-point win to Norwood which enabled it to leap frog Glenelg on the ladder. The Bays, now second by a mere 0.2 per cent, are concerned about defender Wayne Stringer who also suffered a knee injury. The extent of the damage will not be known until today.

Suddenly, Cahill's luck changed

The match was barely 15 minutes into the second quarter and John Cahill wore that familiar harried look.

Watching from his Alberton Oval vantage point, Cahill sat disappointed and disgruntled as Port, searching for some credibility after a series of less than convincing performances, shuffled from one ghastly error to another.

If the trend continued. Cahill reasoned the consequences for Port would prove diabolical against a highly professional, successful Glenelg.

Almost without sign or reason the tide began to change. Glenelg coach Graham Cornes would later point to the same moment and claim this was when Glenelg lost the match and Port won it.

It is difficult to disagree.

For the opening 40 minutes, Glenelg had done little to erode its claim to superiority, even on Alberton Oval, against one of its more loathed opponents.

By failing to maintain intensity and concentration, Glenelg forfeited an advantage it would never regain.

From then on, it struggled to rediscover its line as the spirited, committed Magpies shovelled, scrambled and finally with skill forged their way to a 10-point victory.

The repercussions for Glenelg were obvious in the club's subdued changerooms immediately after the match as officials – not entirely familiar with failure searched for reasons and solutions.

They could be found however, with the Port spirit which carried it through difficult times and finally led it to victory.

Earlier, such a result looked unlikely. Trailing by 33 points, Port's improvement was stunning as it was unexpected.


And several players contributed to the success.

Allied to this determined pair were the talents of Bruce Abernethy, David Brown, Greg Phillips and Darren Smith.

And adding the finishing touch to strong work further afield was exciting new spearhead Scott Hodges, whose strong marking resulted in five goals when Port needed

them most. Glenelg, conversely, was more spectacular than Port - but lacked the finishing skills.

As Cornes was to point out, some of his players were committed and resourceful but lacked discipline and concentration when the match was by no means over.

Statistically, Glenelg may have proved superior, but too often it seemed more concerned with flashiness rather than sound, productive football.

Courageous Scott whose endeavor can never be questioned, was an exception as he strode to ignite a lethargic Glenelg which

was without Peter Carey. Salisbury received strong support from Chris McDermott, Tony Symonds, David Marshall, Alan Stringer and Gary Christie, whose centre square ruck work was outstanding.

However, Glenelg's problems seemed to stem from its attitude towards an opponent it should never again underestimate - even when it seems beaten.

It's a familiar story, but Glenelg, now paying the price for its apathy, seems loath to heed the lessons

of past years. If Cornes' controlled anger after the game was any indication, the Tigers will not be so easily pushed aside - in a mental sense anyway - next

time these clubs meet. Port, deserving its success, could rest easily last night having given more credence to its claims as a genuine premiership
