

HART SHOCK FOR NORTH

Just one kick ... and North Adelaide tumbled from second place to sixth.

And its captain Darel Hart George Fiacchi at the 10 minute will face league commissioner Mr Brian Martin, QC, tomorrow night.

These were the bad breaks for the reigning premier after it lost by four points to Port Adelaide at Football Park.

Port made an astonishing last quarter comeback, coming from 21 points down and restricting North to a paltry two points.

Coach John Cahill admitted that early in the last term, when he looked at the progressive scores from other games, he feared his side would be dumped to sixth.

However, Port is now a game clear in second place and only one premiership point from Central District.

Hart, who finished equal second to teammate Andrew Jarman in last year's Magarey Medal count, was reported by field umpire Laurie Argent for allegedly striking Port's

mark of the third term.

Some North officials were angry, not because Argent lodged a report based on what he believed he saw, but because other reportable offences went unnoticed.

In my opinion, the most blatant offence missed was a blow to North ruckman Mike Redden by the members' stand wing within a few metres of a boundary umpire.

North coach Mike Nunan, using his Masters Degree in Diplomacy, said: "Something should be said about Laurie Argent but it's not going to be from me."

during the third term. The charge was made by field umpire Michael Abbott.

North was replaced in the five by Sturt which beat Torrens by 28 points at Thebarton. Sturt has now won seven of its past eight matches.

Other top five sides scored victories as expected - Norwood (by 60 points over West Adelaide), Glenelg (by 14 over Woodville) and Central (by 178 over South Adelaide).

Adding to North's woes was a hamstring injury to defender John Riley who is expected to miss this week's match against Torrens at Prospect.

Glenelg's Craig Budarick also strained a hamstring and could be doubtful for the big clash with Central.

West Adelaide wingman Paul Ravesi will have X-rays on his ribs and may miss the clash with Port at Alberton.

Glenelg win's a win

Glenelg's 14-point win over Woodville will not go down as its best victory of the season.

But it was a game which Glenelg had to win. Its success indicated a fundamental toughness that will please club officials and supporters.

After successive losses to Port, West and Sturt, Glenelg desperately needed some success to steady the ship leading into the final part of the season.

Woodville, desperate to regain some of the prestige it has lost after its promising start, also needed a win — which indicated both sides would have a fair dinkum go, to coin a phrase.

And that was how it was. While the game was not pretty, it was hard fought.

But in the end, Glenelg had just a little more poise, slightly more experience and knowledge of how to handle things when they got tight and a little more toughness than the Warriors.

It did things just a little better, manning up in defence slightly more quickly, tackling harder and disposing just fractionally more cleanly.

On the occasions Woodville did take control, it would undo the good work by giving up an easy goal or two through a lack of consistent pressure.

It is an indication of a lack of maturity and something which can only be overcome through experience and hard work, as coach Russell Ebert was prepared to concede at the end of the match.

The game opened at a cracking pace, with Woodville taking early control and moving to a two goal break during the first term. But instead of consolidating, it allowed Glenelg to settle, and by quarter time the game was tied up.

The second quarter was a similar story and by half time, the game was still wide open. But in the third term, Glenelg began to get on top.

It was not reflected on the scoreboard. but the Bays were doing things a little more easily, moving the ball more

smoothly, and from that point it was a case of Woodville trying to catch up. Glenelg owed much to the reliable Chris McDermott for its win.

He was a constant ball winner and his disposal was immaculate, bringing other players around him into the game.

Tony McTavish was another live wire, especially in the first half, while Nick Chigwidden, brought into the side at the last minute, showed good patches of play.

David Marshall played consistently and was able to lift his play in the last quarter when required to be another strong performer, while Peter Maynard was useful.

But no-one really dominated the game to the extent that Woodville ruckman Romano Negri did.

With Glenelg's Peter Carey playing almost exclusively at full forward, Negri was able to dominate the centre bounces, while his play around the field was excellent for such a big man.

He managed to bring in players such as Kevin Harris and newcomer Darren Klemm on a consistent basis.

Budarick now added to Glenelg injury list

Colin McDonald performed strongly on his wing, while Peter Schwarz was useful.


But the end result was a loss and the end of Woodville's finals prospects.

Glenelg's performance was sound, but it did not give the impression it is yet travelling smoothly enough to take on any of its fellow top five opponents with a great deal of conviction.

The large injury list was increased when half forward Craig Budarick hurt a hamstring.

But this week at least it is back in the winning circle, and safely in the fight for a finals spot.
