# The big Bay raid

Glenelg slipped quietly into Adelaide yesterday, went about its work with a professional and direct approach and headed home to the Bay, satisfied and already contemplating its next target.

Like a group of ruthless gangsters from out of town, Graham Cornes's Tigers carried out their latest raid with a minimum of fuss to demolish a disappointing West Torrens by a whopping 85-points.

And it left a ragged Eagles combination bewildered and in need of a massive life-saving transfusion.

Surely, there are few sides in the SANFL capable of ending a contest as quickly as Glenelg.

Those days have been few and far between this winter, but yesterday it systematically crushed the Eagles with brutal efficiency.

The importance of yesterday's clash was enormous — for both Glenelg and Torrens.

Indeed, their finals aspirations could have hinged on the showdown.

The Eagles, after such a promising start to the season, have slowly fallen from grace and are now walking football's tightrope.

They have lost their past five matches and are in dire straits in the countdown to the finals.

Plastered in chalk on a blackboard in the Torrens rooms after the game was the word "Character"... yes, that was sadly missing yesterday.

Typically, Glenelg, reacted angrily to last week's hiding by Central District on the vast expanses of Elizabeth Oval.

In the battle for the all-important third spot, the Tigers stamped their authority on the game in the first term and Torrens did not recover.

Rod Jameson in the centre was superb, winning a magnificent 11 touches in the opening 30 minutes and hurting the Eagles all-day.

In attack, Jim West was a focal point, Kym Hodgeman was a constant threat around the goals and

the Tiger defence was forever tight, tough and rebounding.

Apart from courageous rover Simon Neave and wingman Troy Clarke, Torrens had few contributors.

Neave was brilliant, finishing the game with 6.1 of the team's miserable total of 9.9, while Clarke continued his good form with another fine effort.

Yesterday could not have ended more dishearteningly for the Eagles and one could feel sympathy for courageous utility players Lee Robson, Bob Enright and Ian Hanna who were all to be honored at a \$50-a-head testimonial dinner last night.

Jameson was brilliant for the Tigers. He has played just 12 games for Glenelg, but on yesterday's effort, he is destined for greater things.

In the first term he was a constant headache for Eagles' coach Andy Bennett and he remained a fine contributor.

Captain Chris McDermott was again the player for the moment, winning many possessions and setting up play.

Darren Mansell and Tony MacTavish rated highly while Kym Hodgeman was a livewire all day. He is having a grand season and yesterday left the ground in the final term to a great ovation from the Tiger fans.

Jim West at full forward marked beautifully and finished with 5.2, Tony Symonds caught the eye on his wing, Dennis Russell was too good for Eagles' spearhead Chris Lindsay, and Chris Melican in ruck was a consistent influence on play.

For Torrens, Simon Neave played a lone hand and probably was best afield.

He battled valiantly against overwhelming odds and did all he could to lift his flagging side.

And on his wing, Troy Clarke was a key performer, using his pace to great advantage.
