# Eagle giant dwarfs Bays



Beanpole West Torrens full forward Chris Lindsay yesterday booted eight goals to spearhead the Eagles to a gritty 22-point win over grand finalist Glenelg at Football Park.

Lindsay, 206 centimetres, was a huge obstacle that Glenelg, despite its unbending spirit, could not counter as Torrens impressively completed the first series of matches.

Torrens, trailing by eight points early in the last term, lifted to add 5.7 to Glenelg's 1.1 to earn a victory that leaves Andrew Bennett's team in third place with a healthy 6-3 win-loss record after the first nine matches.

Glenelg, conversely, has never sagged to such depths, statistically, at least, since coach Graham Cornes returned to Brighton Rd in 1985, and currently laments a modest 3-6 scoreline.

The Tigers worked extremely hard but did not show the flawless teamwork and system that has carried the club to the past four league grand finals.

On yesterday's performance, Glenelg will struggle to make the final five. The closeness of the competition is in its favor, but it is playing without confidence and with inhibition.

Torrens, however, can reasonably expect to contest the final series, if it can maintain its impetus.

It should have won by much more yesterday, given the wide disparity in scoring shots — 34 to 22 — and the comparative numbers of in-form players.

The key to its victory was its unremitting work-rate when playing into a fearsome, five-goal southerly wind and then its intelligent use of the ball when wind-assisted.

Torrens kicked a total of 6.5 to Glenelg's 5.3 at the less-favored southern end and to collected 10.13 to 9.5 at the more popular northern end in a changeable, error-ridden affair.

Glenelg began encouraginly enough, but was plagued by a wasteful inaccuracy that was, ultimately, far surpassed by that of its opponent.

### Andrew Bennett said:

"As a group I thought we were able to lift when the game was there to be won."

### **Graham Cornes said:**

"I think we worked very hard without the system that is necessary and I think some of our effort, unfortunately, was ill-directed."

It would have been disappointed by its meagre five-point quarter-time advantage but satisfied for most of its second quarter performance when it stalled most Eagle attempts to break

It was only during an ominous 11-minute period immediately before half-time that Torrens was able to derive full value from its endeavors when Frank Spiel, Bruce Lindsay, Simon Neave, Chris Lindsay, Gerard Toohey and Scott Morphett ran riot.

For much of the contest, Glenelg either led or hovered dangerously close to Torrens, which finally sneaked away in the final 15 minutes to secure two invaluable premiership points.

Ruck-rover Bruce Lindsay, ruckman Spiel and rover Neave were superbly committed throughout the match and received tremendous support from a typically dour, occasionally dashing defence.

Chris Lindsay, however, was a critical difference with which neither Adam Garton nor Chris Melican could successfully contend.

A total five goals after half-time, when the match was there to be won, was grand testimony to the ruckman-forward's desire, endeavor — and great height.

Glenelg, without injured John Fidge, entrusted centre half-forward Jim West and Craig Budarick, recovered from serious leg injury, with the major responsibility for amassing a winning score.


West turned in a sensational second term, with three goals, while Budarick did enough — he was credited with 3.2, after what appeared to be one goal was adjudged a behind — to suggest he will again pose an intimidating threat to opposition defences.

Veteran rover Kym Hodgeman, intelligent and skilful, tried valiantly to lift Glenelg but too much was left to too few too often.

Centre half-back John Seebohm, despite some unusual final quarter errors, and Tony MacTavish, responsible for a fantastic four-quarter effort, were among the Bay's best.

The tragedy is, however, that Glenelg's best is currently not good enough.

Only time will tell if it can improve in time to be the force it is expected to be.
