High-flying Port Adelaide full forward Scott Hodges took centre-stage for the opening of the 1990 SANFL season yesterday with a magnificent 10-goal performance against Central District.

As 38,995 fans flocked to the opening round of league matches, Hodges entertained the crowd of 10,229 at Elizabeth Oval with a dazzling display of football aerobatics, precision kicking and solid ground play.

But Hodges was just one of the architects of the Magple's mighty 92-point victory over the disappointing Bulldogs the reigning premier's first win at Elizabeth since 1986.

Hodges left the field late in the final term with a knee problem but according to Magpie officials it was only a precautionary move.

However some doubt remains over the fitness of rover Tim Ginever who injured a driving muscle during the game.

At The Parade, 12,871 supporters filled the stands to the rafters as North Adelaide eclipsed Norwood by 32-points. Billed as a promoter's dream, the

guernsey for the first time in a league match - pitting his skills against his old club and his younger brother. Darren.

The Tigers were superb in the third term kicking 9.3 to just 0.3 by the Eagles to finally triumph by 40 points.

In the other results vesterday, Russell Ebert's Woodville secured two premiership points by downing South Adel-





Glenelg soothed some of the pain from one of the most traumatic weeks in the club's history with a vengeful. surprisingly easy win against West Torrens at Football Park.

Glenelg owed its 40-point margin to a powerhouse third quarter in which it blitzed Torrens 9.3 to 0.3. For the other three quarters of a generally scrappy, easily forgotten skirmish, Torrens outgunned Glenelg 9.7 to 7.5, including 6.5 to 4.4 in the first half.

Glenelg full forward John Fidge. much fitter, slimmer and more mobile than last season, led cleverly, marked strongly and kicked 7.5 in a best-afield performance that would have done wonders for his

He booted 5.2 in the third term, including 3.0 in an early seven-minute spurt that helped inspire the Tigers' resurgence.

Torrens' abrupt fade-out coincided with a slick, overdue lift in Glenelg's workrate and, significantly, Torrens captain Bruce Lindsay's shift to a forward pocket for the start of the second half.

Named at centre, but playing more of a go-anywhere, following role, he was the driving force behind his side's strong opening.

But, inexplicably, Lindsay stayed in a forward pocket or on a halfforward flank for much of the second half — and was credited with only one kick — while Scott Morphett handled most of the ruckroving duties.

With Glenelg blazing away, Lindsay's inactivity at the other end of the ground must have been distressingly wasteful for frustrated Eagle

Early, they had been buoyed by Torrens' urgent, willing start against a Glenelg outfit that often looked sluggish and complacent enough to suggest it still was recovering from the after-effects of its Foundation Cup final triumph against Woodville and the Salisbury Affair.

Glenelg was fortunate to be only 13 points down at half-time.

Better, more experienced teams than Torrens would have reaped bigger rewards for expending so much energy against such a struggling opponent.

David Niemann, 18, Torrens' tall, strong full forward, threatened to put Glenelg out of business completely by booting 4.2 of the Eagles' 6.3 until midway through the second quarter.

John Seebohm was shifted from full back to centre half-back after Niemann had kicked two goals -



the first 15 minutes into the first quarter, the second four minutes into the second term.

When Niemann sank his third at the nine-minute mark of the second quarter, Craig Elias went from full back to the interchange bench and Allan Bartlett was summoned from centre half-forward to spend the rest of the game as Niemann's

Niemann finished with 5.3 of Torrens' 9.10. He will be an even more exciting prospect if he can get more distance into his kicking.

Little Troy Clarke, on a forward flank, in a pocket and on the ball, was Torrens' hardest worker. Andrew Payze was prominent on a wing and Wayne Weidemann had some productive moments at halfforward and also on the ball.

But too many Eagles were not sighted often enough when it mattered most, which sounds a familiar story for a club that hasn't won a premiership since 1953.

Fidge aside, and he was well fed eventually, Glenelg gained considerable momentum from tall wingman Rod Jameson, classy centreman David Marshall, bustling half-back flankers Lynden Bow and Robbie Thompson, old-hand rover Kym Hodgeman and skipper Chris McDermott until he walked off wearily in the last quarter.

Paul Rouvray, on a forward flank and at centre half-forward, again confirmed his immense potential with three cool goals, and Matthew Liptak also looked a goer as a rover when he was released off the bench.

As expected, as usual, the starting line-ups for Glenelg and Torrens bore little resemblance to those they had released to the media originally.

It's a pity such clubs continue to treat us and their supporters as suckers.
