McDermott limped from the ground late in the game against South Adelaide at Football Park and is understood to have a serious hamstring injury.

And star forward John Fidge was stretchered from the field after 28 minutes with a dislocated left shoulder. It was re-set by doctors during the game.

The injuries highlighted a sensational 13th round of football which included several upsets, the reporting of Norwood defender Brenton Klaebe and the continuation of the fight for the key fifth spot.

### Tigers blitz South in 10-minute barrage

Chris McDermott-led second half recovery at Football Park yesterday nipped in the bud what was shaping up to be a fairy tale victory to John Reid's vastly improved South Adelaide.

After more than an hour of a giving a convincing performance as the sleeping giant of the competition, Glenelg kicked itself into gear and brushed aside a determined first half challenge thrown out by the Panthers.

Glenelg overcame the loss of star goal-sneak John Fidge, who was gingerly taken by stretcher down the players' race with a dislocated shoulder after just 28 minutes of play, and a two-goal deficit at both quarter and half-times, to pull off a convincing 76-point win.

For two quarters South dominated the game. South players worked hard to win the race to the fall of the ball but proved unable to capitalise on the posessions they won, and by the time the shadows lengthened over the ground so had the odds on the Panthers bringing down the ladderleader.

Nigel Smart was evident in his role as a key play-maker for the Panthers and the characteristically solid defence of David Kappler, Michael Whitford, Peter McCarty and Steven Schmid was intact for much of the first half, but the statistics tell the story of how South squandered the golden opportunities it was so graciously handed by the napping Tigers.
