Roasting for Roosters

It's the wrong time of year to blame daylight saving, so it must be the greenhouse effect that's responsible for the weird things happening this football season.

The poor hole-ridden ozone layer and the corresponding greenhouse effect get blamed for everything these days.

But what else can you pinpoint as the reason behind results such as Carlton — the team that managed only one goal a couple of weeks ago — beating the West Coast and our own Eagles, victorious over premiers favorite South Adelaide last week, losing to West Adelaide yesterday?

Whether it was that atmospheric menace or Macbeth's witches, something wicked certainly came the way of North Adelaide as it fell to the visiting Tigers at Prospect Oval yesterday.

Glenelg, 19 points clear at quarter time, was troubled by the Roosters in only the second term, before gradually building a lead that stood at 35 points when the final siren sounded.

If there was a magical presence at Prospect, it decided to inflict its Puckish menace on the boots of the Roosters, who — despite possessing much of the ball and having the same number of goal attempts as the Bays — for no visible reason could not score.

After the first term they had amassed seven points from seven shots; when they left the field for a half-time roasting, 13 points from 15 attempts. That inexplicable inaccuracy cost them the game.

Glenelg, however, appeared to have more than enough men willing to put their bodies on the line to win the ball, then able to send that ball flying between the white posts.

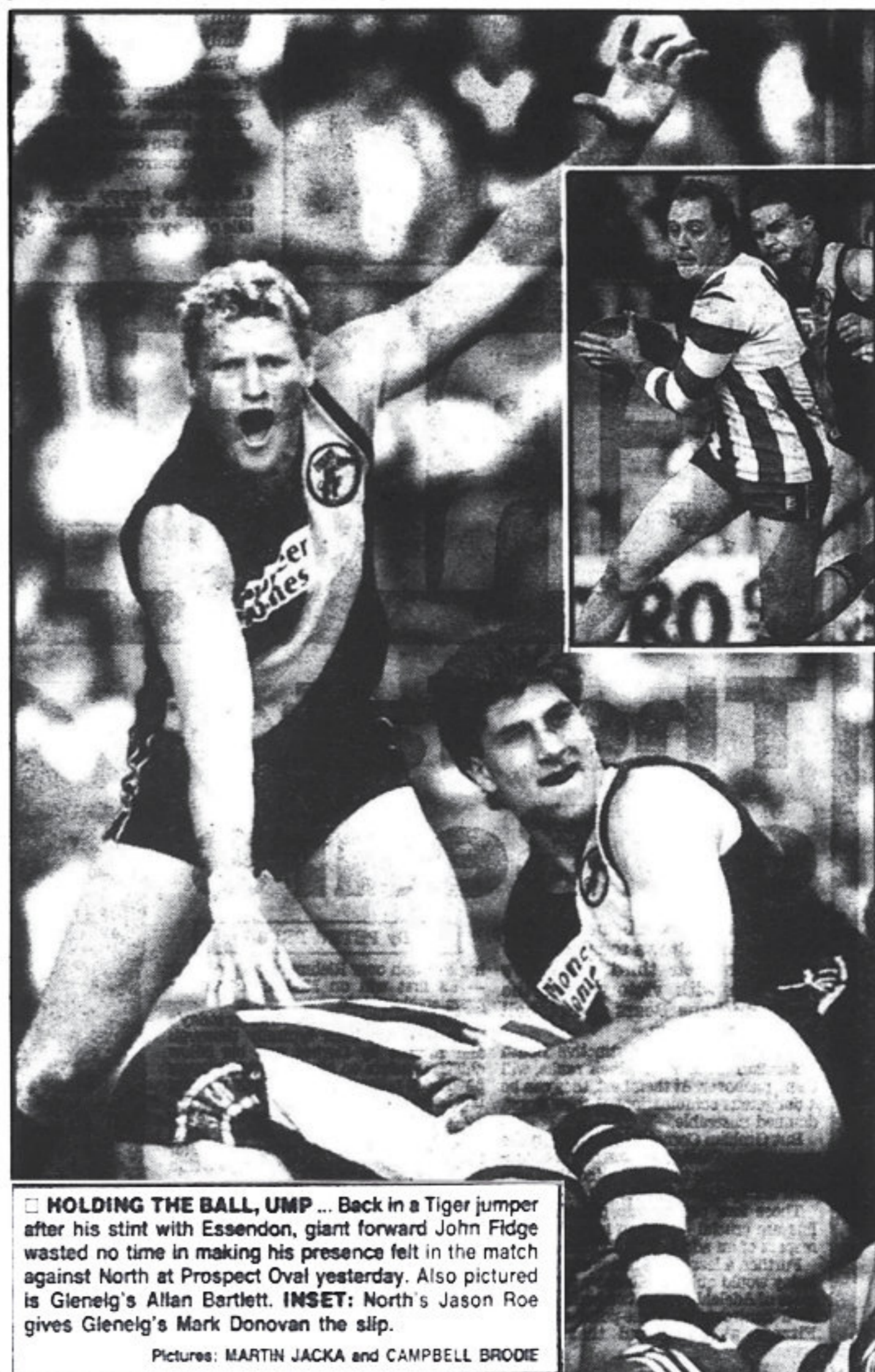
From the first term, when Nick Chigwidden, Mark Russell and Simon Hele dominated the grounded packs, through to the last when North finally demonstrated the fight that has had it leading the SANFL ladder for so long, the Tigers fought and won most of the struggles and cleared the ball with an ease missing from North's attempts.

The only man in a red and white guernsey who threatened to guide his team into domination was Michael Parsons, whose first-quarter rucking and strong marking were largely responsible for the number of times North could work the ball towards its goal.

But after Glenelg coach Kym Hodge-man whispered a few well-chosen words to Parsons' opponent, Stuart McCully, the youngster playing his seventh league game changed tactics, and his close tagging of the 135-game veteran negated his effect.

North, without injured champions including Mick Redden, Peter Bennett, David Sanders and Peter Krieg, found itself with limited guidance.

With Glenelg increasingly able to find players around the ground willing to act like leaders — Russell, Elias, in the last half Darren Mansell — and others like McCully, young Jason McIntosh and Mark Viska equally happy to be led, even the Roosters' six-goal last-quarter charge was not enough.
