Timely reminder for Norths

Glenelg may have done North Adelaide a huge favor at Football Park yesterday.

It wasn't intentional, but Glenelg reminded North players they have a lot of work to do to be a threat in the 1991 finals.

Glenelg will miss its first finals round since 1983. Its hopes of snatching fifth spot went out the window when West toppled competition leader Eagles at Richmond Oval.

But at least Glenelg restored some lost pride with yesterday's 19.12 to 18.8 victory.

The Bays trailed North by three goals at the 20-minute mark of the final term but five late goals without reply gave them a stirring, spirited triumph.

After last Monday night's shock loss to Central, Glenelg had to rely on other teams beating West. The Eagles spoiled that plan when they succumbed by 14 points.

Glenelg coach Kym Hodgeman said he was pleased with his team's approach, perseverance, reaction to pressure, and cohesion.

"They learnt today that if

you don't have that game attitude every week, you miss the finals — that's what we're going to do, miss the finals," he said.

North had been flirting with disaster. It escaped with a draw against Norwood and then held on for a one-point win against the Eagles in the past fortnight.

Yesterday, just when it appeared to have the game in its keeping, it went missing.

"That's better than a 15-goal win," North coach Mike Nunan said after yesterday's game.

He said his team "didn't maintain intensity and there are mental and skill deficiencies.

"I'm nappy. It's given us something to work on," he concluded.

North has the bye next weekend before playing either the Eagles or South in the September 14 qualifying final.

North started yesterday's

match well and had 4.2 to 0.2 on the board midway through the opening term. Glenelg hit back but inaccurate kicking meant North led 5.2 to 2.7 at the change.

Glenelg assumed control and kicked better in the second term, adding 6.2 to 2.3, to hold a 10-point lead at half time.

In the third quarter, North booted four goals to regain the lead, Glenelg then booted four goals to put its nose back in front, and North kicked another five goals (giving it nine without a miss for the term) to lead by 17 points.

By the 20-minute mark of the final term, Glenelg was 18 points in arrears. A spectacular fightback swept it to victory.

North was certainly given a jolt. Glenelg exposed a few weaknesses and Bay players today must rue the fact they will not be around at finals time to test their newfound mettle against other contenders for the flag.
