Magpies on warpath

The warning bells are ringing loud and clear: Don't write off the mighty Magpies just yet!

That old footballing brigade of Port Adelaide, the unrelenting, never-say-die outfit other supporters love to hate, is back.

Castigated, trashed and denigrated this winter after some woeful performances, it signalled a warning to the major round finalists with a courageous 21-point victory over Glenelg at Football Park yesterday.

The Magpies won 15.15 (105) to 12.12 (84) to finetune themselves for next Saturday's cut-throat elimination final against giantkilling West Adelaide.

Further, it is likely to field an even stronger combination next week with the return of dynamic Crows rover David Brown.

For Port, there was little riding on yesterday's clash with arch foe Glenelg. It's sights were set on the knockout battle with the Bloods, although coach John Cahill made it clear to Football Park

the media the club was in need of a last-ditch solid hit out against the Tigers.

"I thought it was a good gutsy win," Cahill said.

"We didn't function as well up forward as we did elsewhere around the ground. But today I saw some signs that I haven't seen for six or seven weeks."

True enough. The Magpies were courage personified yesterday, even having to battle against the wind for three quarters after a late change in weather conditions.

And there was no questioning the Tigers commitment and desire — they were desperate all day especially considering it defender was Seebohm's 300th, and possibly last league game for the club. [Seebohm will make a decision on his career during the off-season after a wonderful career).

Many consider the Magples have lost their spark but to be sure, they are surely slowly. welding together a formidible outfit.

Seeking its fourth consecutive flag, the club has been markedly strengthened by the return from injury of some of its key performers including forward Darren Smith, resolute defender George Fiacchi and ruckman Wes Fellowes.

Clearly, Port cannot be ruled out of contention.

Wingman David Hutton was arguably its best yesterday with 21 kicks, three marks and two handballs. And his three goals in that tight last term possibly made the difference between the sides.

Darren Smith was another huge contributer gathering 20 kicks, 10 marks, four handpasses and 4.1. And then there were the likes of rover Tim Ginever who is close to his best, outstanding junior Nathan Buckley on a wing and back-pocket George Fiacchi.

For its part, Glenelg has finished in sixth spot — the first time it has missed the finals since 1983.


