First there was that saga surrounding one of Glenelg's favorite sons, Ross Gibbs, culminating in the Supreme Court's rejection of his application for a judicial review of the case that had seen him suspended for 10 games.

There was even talk of Tiger mentor Kym Hodgeman threatening to step down from his coaching throne in protest over the controversial matter.

If that wasn't enough, Glenelg was in the midst of an on-field football slump, having lost its past three games after such a promising start to the season.

But as coach Hodgeman admitted after yesterday's clash with the Eagles at Football Park, there's finally something to gladden the hearts of Bay fans.

An impressive Glenelg returned to the winners' list with a convincing 42-point victory in a performance which would have provided much solace in light of recent events at the club.

"That's the first time I've been able to smile in three or four weeks," Hodgey said. "That was a very even performance. In recent weeks they've been trying as individuals, but today they really started to work as a team. They did all the

little things the hard things. At last something's gone our way."

Glenelg pulled the first surprise of the match when star forward Clayton Lamb took his place in the side. Hampered by an ankle problem, he was regarded as doubtful, but declared his fitness at the 11th hour with a phone call to Hodgeman.

The Tigers opened brilliantly. They booted eight goals in a fine first term with Darren Mansell the man for the occasion. He finished with 3.1 for the term and 5.5 for the game, flashing in and out of the play and proving real nuisance value to the Eagle defenders.

Glenelg had numerous options in attack. Spearhead John Seeborn was a constant danger with five goals, while promising youngster Mark Russell and Lamb each kicked three goals.

Then there was skipper Scott Salisbury whose courage and inspiration knows no boundary. He

won the hard ball, took the hard body and gave out the hard knocks. As Hodgeman said later: "The man has no fear".

In defence Craig Elias was a winner, while Matthew Liptak, Nick Chigwidden and Simon Hele continually hurt the Eagles.

Nell Balme's new outfit battled away all day, but the Tigers had all the winning cards.

Ron Fuller was an enormous contributor a fine playmaker who finished with 28 kicks, three marks and 18 handballs.

Another to do well was former Tiger Peter Maynard, while defender Garry Haylock performed creditably along with young Matthew James (four goals).

The Eagles, after five successive victories, hit a king-sized hurdle last week against North and yesterday were handed another football lesson. Balme clearly is still juggling to find the right balance but they will hit back.
