Yesterday's success was the Tigers' fifth in nine matches, and sweet revenge for their 52-point loss to South at Glenelg Oval in the opening series.


The Panthers torpedoed their chances with inaccurate kicking for goal — 8.17, including 0.8 in the third quarter.

The Eagles are considering their choices and plan to survey members soon on a possible move away from Football Park.

It is believed the club could shift one of its Football Park "home" matches to Woodville later this year to "test the market".
