Norwood kicked 10 goals in the first quarter but still lost to Glenelg by 17 points in a spectacular goal-spree at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

wingmen Lynden Bow and Grant Reubenicht (off the bench) combined with Mansell to complete a winning centre-line.

As a result, there was no shortage of opportunities for grateful forwards, of whom Mark Russell, in a pocket, and Clayton Lamb, on a flank, were the most damaging.

Russell, a deceptively strong overhead mark and an equally sound kick, scored seven goals, while Lamb booted three and was responsible for several others with his unselfish team play.

Chris Melican rucked aggressively until he almost fell over with fatigue, and Allan Bartlett shrugged off the disappointment of being delisted by the Crows and was always conspicuous, particularly when switched to centre half-back.

Norwood relied largely on the efforts of back pocket Brett James, forward pocket Michael Aish (six goals), rover-cum-backpocket Lester Ross and big David Pittman, a muchimproved, mobile and highmarking performer at centre half-

forward and in ruck. Norwood captain Garry McIntosh did not look to be complete-

ly recovered from his calf injury. Rover Stephen Rowe's late spell on the bench suggested he may have come back a week too early from his appendix surgery.

Glenelg coach Kym Hodgeman said last night: "Every time we play Norwood, they seem to get that initial thrust, with their quick hands. But I knew if we persevered we would wear them down eventually — and we did."

Norwood coach Neil Craig said: "There was huge pressure on us at centre and on the ball."

Draft just another game of jeopardy

The appalling iniquity that is the Australian Football League midyear draft, once as distant as the MCG itself, hit home savagely last week when Adelaide reluctantly jettisoned three players from its roster.

Whatever deficiencies Romano Negri, Robbie Thompson and Allan Bartlett were deemed to have at the highest level, the question begs: did they deserve to be chopped in such a manner so public and so humiliating? The answer, of course, is no. But since

reality dictates action, Negri, Thompson and Bartlett, who had played a total of 22 games between them, were always going to be in some jeopardy when Adelaide came to trim its list.

Of the trio, only ruckman Negri was called upon to wear the Crows guernsey in a premiership match this season (in the opening-round loss to Footscray).

Bartlett and Thompson, both of whom have battled injuries, have, for players of their talent, spent an inordinate amount of time in the Glenelg reserves, victims seemingly of attempting to serve two masters.



Whatever their circumstances, and regardless of club affiliation and personal opinion of the threesome as players, it is not difficult to sympathise with all of them. In all, 41 players were

told, one way or the other, they no longer had an AFL club. For Wayne Henwood, Mark Majerczak, Michael Ford and Alan Thorpe, it was double jeopardy.

The quartet had transferred during the internal draft in March. It is a question now of whether any of them will take another chance.

Why would they? If the lavish, money-waving seduction of a player heralds the beginning of an AFL career, no matter how uncertain, then the pre-draft pruning generally signifies death.

There are, mercifully,

exceptions to the harshest of rules.

Geelong maestro Malcolm Blight has made an art form of deriving useful service from players supposedly beyond it.

This year the Cats seconded Geoff Miles from duties in the Western Australian Football League.

Miles joined Andrew Rogers (Essendon) and Trevor Poole (Richmond), among others, in a team widely regarded as the omnipotent force in the AFL. Miles, in Blight's eyes, is no less valuable for his years, however advanced.

Kevin Sheedy, too, is not averse to giving discards another chance.

There is, clearly, hope for Adelaide's lost trio. It will be of dubious consolation to them that history will show them to be pioneers for the Adelaide cause.

History, sadly, will also show those same names and spare a thought, too. for Bruce Lindsay and Tom Warhurst, who were cut pre-season — as Adelaide's first victims.

Tigers warn AFL

Glenelg chief Laurie Rosewarne is adamant and a trifle aggressive about AFL scouts "sniffing" around four outstanding Tiger youngsters.

"Stay away. They all are contracted and we won't be releasing them," he vowed.

"All four are outstanding prospects with the potential to become regular AFL players," said Rosewarne, who suspects Victorian-based clubs already have made overtures.

The four young stars, all of whom are being closely monitored by Crows' coach Graham Cornes and his assistant Michael Taylor, are: ☐ Prolific ball-winning rover

Dwaine Kretschmer, 20, who was dropped off Fitzroy's list at the end of last season after playing Under 19s and reserves. He is eligible for the AFL's internal draft on Wednesday but Glenelg has contracted him for three years. ☐ Desperate and dashing half-

back flanker Andrew McKay, 22, recruited from Lucindale in the South-East and contracted until the end of next season. ☐ Tough, rebounding half-back

flanker Mark Viska, 21, who came

from O'Sullivan Beach almost directly into the Bays' league side and already is in the Crows' week in preparation for Wednesday's draft.

☐ Solid and strong centre halfback Hamish Stuart, 22, who also is contracted until the end of next season.

Glenelg coach Kym Hodgeman declared: "All four are outstanding AFL material. They are superb, determined youngsters who listen and learn.

"Yes, the Crows should go after the other three as well as Viska. "And yes, Cornsey already has had a few nibbles about them."

Hodgeman believes Carlton recently had words with as "very quick, very good".

Referring to his three halfbacks - McKay, Stuart and Viska — Hodgeman said: "With sheer strength and dash they have stabilised our defence all season. They are keeping out of the side a 300-game player like John Seebohm and other proven

players Tony Symonds and Craig Elias.

"They are just so strong, they

push away, they create — perhaps the only fault with the three half-backs is that they tend to over-stretch when kicking and the kick can go astray."

A former champion rover, list of 52 which was cut to 49 last Hodgeman lavished praise on Kretschmer, whom he hopes will ignore Carlton and turn out in a Crows guernsey.

"He's that fast, creative and has all the attributes to make the highest grade," said Hodgeman.
