

Tigers add to Roosters' woes

The despair for reigning premier North Adelaide continues, with yesterday's one-point loss to Glenelg chalking up the Rooster's third defeat in three outings.

It is the second week in a row North has lost by the narrowest of margins, following last weekend's one-point loss to 1992 pace-setter South Adelaide.

Glenelg, the reigning night premier, scored its first win of the season in the 17.15 to 17.14 thriller at the Bay.

Rooster wingman Marc Marshall could have been the hero of

the day after being awarded a mark as the final siren sounded. However, his kick from about 30 metres only resulted in a behind.

South forward David Stoeckel had no trouble finding the goals in the final term of the match at Football Park against West Adelaide. He booted five goals in nine minutes midway through the final term to help South to a 23.15 to 16.9 victory.

South defender Simon Quinn left the field after just three minutes of play with a dislocated shoulder. However when teammates Peter McIntyre and Dar-

ren Troy had to be rested with hamstring injuries, Quinn came back with his shoulder heavily strapped to play an important role in South's victory.

Norwood and Crows ruckman David Pittman may miss the next two matches after straining a medial ligament in his knee during his team's 35-point win against Central District at The Parade.

In an unusual turn of events, Eddie Hocking demolished the coach's phone on the interchange bench after having words with Central coach Alan Stewart. Hocking had just been drag-

ged, midway through the final quarter, for conceding a costly 50 metre penalty that resulted in a Norwood goal.

Port Adelaide demolished the disappointing Eagles by 80-points at Alberton Oval - 24.16 (160) to 12.8 (80) with Port full-forward Mark Taylor booting nine goals.

Fans did not abandon domestic footy yesterday. Despite the Crows' gutsy win over Melbourne being beamed into SA live on television, 13,936 people ventured to the four local games.

Another bitter pill for North

North Adelaide defender Marc Marshall's kick after the siren at Glenelg Oval could have resulted in North beating the Tigers by four points yesterday.

Had Marshall, who marked on the bell, kicked straight from 30m out at the southern end, North would have won its first match of the season.

Instead, Marshall kicked a point and Glenelg won its first game of the year, 17.15 (117) to 17.14 (116).

It was the second week in a row that North has lost by a point - last week South inflicted the humiliation.

The Roosters, trailing by 11 points at half-time, had recovered to lead by 16 points at three-quarter time. North still held an advantage 16 minutes into the last term, but it lost the lead and eventually the game after Wayne Thornborrow and Lyndon Bow goaled late in the term.

As the players left the field at quarter-time, it had seemed the Tigers were on track to record their first victory at Brighton Rd since vacating the premises in 1990 for Football Park.

After Peter Turner and Simon Hill had given North a seven-point start, Glenelg added 3.4 without interruption, the goals coming from Nick Chigwidden,

Thornborrow and Grant Reubenicht.

North responded with goals from Brodie Atkinson and Brett Mancini, but the Bays rallied for four goals after the 20-minute mark of the term - with one of them to first-gamer Jarrod Hocking.

Glenelg led by 22 points, 7.6 to 4.2, at the end of the first quarter.

That cushion was padded immediately after the start of the second quarter, Jason Bromilow snapping successfully from 2m out from the northern goal.

Then Tim Nunan decided to have a go. His goal at the fifth minute was the first of three for the term - the second and third the results of kicks from

about 40m out. His effort, combined with Simon Hill's 45m set shot seconds before time-on began, ensured North was well within reach of the Bays, only 11 points in arrears at half-time.

After Lamb boosted the Tigers' lead to 16 points with a goal at the fourth minute of the third quarter, the Roosters slammed four in five minutes - Hill starting the rally, followed by rookies Nick Holland and Mancini, and veteran centre half-forward Peter Bennett. North had snatched the lead for the first time.

By the end of the term, additional goals to Rod Saunders - an explosion from 55m out - Atkinson and Hill had guaranteed it would be the Bays who were required to play catch-up football in the final 30 minutes.

Despite two goals to Clayton Lamb and another to Hocking, North still held a 16-point lead at the break.

Glenelg coach Kym Hodgeman made a quick exit from the ground and was unavailable for comment. However, his team manager, Reg Guppy, said Hodgeman had been pleased with the side's response to his three-quarter time reminder that the game was "there to be won".

Guppy's North Adelaide equal, Peter Whitwell, said "a few stupid things" throughout the match cost the Roosters a victory.
