Cohesion a key to Glenelg win

Glenelg's mid-season resurgence continued and Central District's charge up the premiership ladder faltered in a fluctuating contest yesterday at Football Park

The Tigers, buoyed by a hardfought tie last week against the Eagles, never looked like losing after sprinting to a 40-point lead early in the second quarter.

Ultimately. Glenelg had enough cohesion, superior ball-getting and disposal skills to stifle several Bulldog comebacks

Glenelg coach Mark Williams would have been disappointed by lapses in his team's concentration in the second, third and fourth quarters. He also would have been delighted by several individual performances and the Tigers' fierce commitment to their task

The final margin of 11 points was grossly flattering to Central which, after winning its past four games and generating boundless optimism at Elizabeth, must improve sharply to avoid a "finals pretender" tag.

Central played yesterday's game as though success could be achieved without hard work

There were exceptions - de-

fenders Steven Schwerdt and Hugh Reimers being the most notable.

However, the Bulldogs' lack of forward line firepower and overuse of handball gave them little chance of success

They turned the ball over repeat edly, sometimes handballing straight to the chest of a Glenelg player while under no pressure.

Central played the game without a forward line target. The slow, lethargic display by full forward Grant Coffee posed no threat to the Glenelg defence and centre halfforward Simon Luhrs was largely inneffective

However, Reimers first half effort, mostly against West, was one reason Central was still in the game at half time.




