# Week-long wait before final-five positions decided

# Port hits back as Tigers lick wounds

Port Adelaide wounded Glenelg's pride and its premiership prospects with a resounding 39-point win at Football Park yesterday.

Both teams have an anxious week ahead of them, waiting for next Saturday's results to determine their positions in the final five.

If the Eagles defeat Central District at Elizabeth Oval and Glenelg accounts for West Adelaide at Richmond Oval, the Eagles will take the minor premiership from Port, which has the bye next Saturday — and Port and Glenelg will clash again in the qualifying final on Saturday week, after Norwood and Central have played in the elimination final.

Port wasted its greater share of the ball through inaccurate kicking for goal in the first half yesterday, and trailed by three points — 7.12 to Glenelg's 9.3 — at half-time.

But Port outscored Glenelg 12.10 to 5.10 in the second half and, at the end, could boast 41 scoring shots to 27 - 19.22 to 14.13.

Glenelg was hurt by the quarter-time retirement of full forward John Fidge, who strained a calf muscle in the pre-match warm-up out on the ground, and the half-time demise of captain-rover Nick Chigwidden, who strained a knee in the second term.

And other Tigers were sore enough for coach Mark Williams to lament later that his team finished with "15 or 16 fit men".

When asked whether he thought the match had any significance for the finals, Williams said: "None at all."

"We battled it out well under the circumstances," he said. "We were disappointed about losing, but we'll come back from it.

"Port missed some easy goals early, then we did the same later when the game could have gone either way. "I was satisfied with the way our players ran the game out. I still believe we have the game to beat Port."

Port coach John Cahill said: "It was a good win. Our commitment was good, as it was against Norwood last week, and we were pleased again with the way our youngsters performed under finalstype pressure.

"Glenelg is always a hard team to beat.

"It was hard and hot out there, and it was pleasing the way we kept going.


"We've been up and down for the last seven weeks, and it was important for us to get a good win against a good team.

"This was no fluke. We prepared well during the week, and we had a day's less rest through playing last Sunday.

"That was worrying me

in the heat, but, in the end, our courage kept us going. "If we're top, we're top. If

Phillip McGuinness clears under pressure


finish on top, but we've got next week off, anyway.

Port had a long best players' list, led by slippery rover Troy Bond, strongmarking centre half-forward Darren Smith, who kicked 3.4, rugged half-backs Julian Burton, elusive wingman Rohan Smith and strong utility Richard Foster.

On-ballers Tim Ginever and Shane Bond and defender Brayden Lyle were always prominent, too, and forward Scott Hodges showed signs of recapturing form quickly, after his hamstring problem, with 3.3 until he was rested late in the last quarter.

Glenelg received most value from the on-ball efforts of Phillip McGuinness, Darren Mansell and David Marshall, defender Ross Gibbs and big forward Jim West, who booted 4.2.
