MIGHTY PIES SLAY TIGERS

Landslide in second term sealed fate

Some things never change. Port Adelaide's complete dominance of Glenelg in football matches that matter is one of them.

The Magpies yesterday inflicted the latest blow to Glenelg's self-esteem with a 45-point humbling of the Tigers in front of their home crowd.

They left the Bay \$15,000 richer - courtesy of Fairmont Homes' generous incentive cheque - and two games clear at the top of the SANFL ladder.

Glenelg Oval was bursting at the seams before the match and one of the biggest crowds of the season was buzzing with expectation.

This was to be the contest of the year, a thrilling minor round clash to decide that top spot on the SANFL ladder.

How wrong we were. Port, displaying disturbing superiority and arrogance, was never going to lose.

It exploded into action to boot the first four goals of the game before a 12-minute concentration lapse - coinciding with an escalation of tempers across the Glenelg half-forward line - allowed Glenelg to cut the deficit to a point at quarter time.

But the home team had no answer to Port's second-quarter landslide which netted 7.9 and killed the game off by half-time.

It appears not even the acquisition of Mark Williams from Alberton will be enough to end Glenelg's Magpie misery.

As he and Tylor began to convert Port's attacking surges, wingman Che Cockatoo-Collins started to make an impact and Stephen Williams broke the tag of Greg Whittlesea across half-forward.

Glenelg coach Mark Williams could not be accused of inaction. He took an injured Fidge from the field - reported for charging during that spiteful first term - swung Clayton Lamb to full forward, gave Mark Viska the tag on his brother Stephen and switched centre half-forward Stephen Rattray with centre half-back Jim West. The Glenelg coach also dragged Craig McRae who had struggled to make an impact, replacing him with Dean Bailey.

However, only the move of West to the forward lines made any difference.

"They were too good for us - they destroyed us in the second quarter," Williams said.

"We turned the ball over too easily and missed a lot of shots for goal.

"We've been cruising along for four weeks - we obviously have to improve on what we showed today."

Port coach John Cahill said his team's "toughness and courage in the centre square" won the game.

"We were primed up for this match," he said.

had to if only for the sake of their stunned supporters.

But its effort to outscore the visitors 12.8 to 12.5 in the second half counted for little at the final siren.

Port's dominance started in the centre square where centreman Darren Brown, follower Darryl Borlase and rover Tim Ginever, in his best game of the season, cut Glenelg to ribbons.

It extended to the backlines where Roger Delaney, in shutting down John Fidge and then Clayton Lamb, continued his outstanding season.

Back pocket Brayden Lyle was impressive as were Danny Hughes and Richard Foster.

The creative deeds of the defence and the centre square personnel allowed forward pocket Scott Hodges to perform like the Adelaide Crows have wanted him to for weeks.

Hodges' superb first-half contributions were some of the major differences between the two teams.
