Central ends losing slump

Central District fans can breathe a little easier.

An 18-point win against Glenelg at Football Park yesterday ended a three-game losing slump and returned the Bulldogs to second position. Importantly, with the finals in mind, the win was achieved in difficult circumstances.

With five players carrying injuries by half-time and up against a Glenelg side fighting for its immediate future, the Bulldogs had to call on all their resources to win.

Central always appeared in control and yet came perilously close to losing when Glenelg staged a last-quarter revival and midway through the term had reduced a three-quarter time deficit of 24 points to just five.

But, in the end, Glenelg was made to pay dearly for wasting first use of a strong breeze after looking menacing in the opening minutes with goals to full forward Dean Caldow and Phil McGuinness.

But then Brian Haraida, Central's powerful centre half-back who was back in the side after three weeks on the sidelines, took control. It is no coincidence Central lost each of the games Haraida missed. His presence lifts those around him and it was only a matter of time before his codefenders tightened up to restrict Glenelg's road to goal

Haraida was best-afield, finishing with 18 kicks, seven marks and five handpasses. He tired later as was to be expected, but if he remains fit Central has every chance of winning its first finals match since 1972.

Scott Stevens (17 kicks, six marks, 10 handpasses), who alternated between wing and defence, follower Craig Potter (17, 3, 10) and Stephen Schwerdt (15, 6, 13) who created havoc as a rover and later as a defender.

Central coach Alan Stewart was pleased with the result.

"We had some problems at half time with injuries but the boys found a bit in the third term when they were kicking into the breeze," he said.

"Considering the circumstances of the day when it was a must win for Glenelg we were able to find something after half-time and then in the final term. It was satisfying but there is still a lot of room for improvement. That's the important thing, we can improve."

Stewart was concerned in the last quarter when Glenelg got to within five points but impresed with the way his side fought back.

He reserved special mention for full forward Adam Richardson who had no impact on the game until the final stages when he blocked a kick from a Glenelg

defender that resulted in a goal to Jarrod Cotton.

"It goes to show if you keep at it you'll get something out of it," Stuart said.

"While the game may not have looked very impressive from outside the fence we were glad to get the two points."

Coach Mark Williams said Glenelg drifted in and out of the game but he was pleased with the way his side battled in the last quarter to get back into the game.


He thought poor use of the ball in the third term probably cost his side the points.

"We battled pretty well but, unfortunately, we turned the ball over too many times when there was no pressure on us at all," Williams said.
