Glenelg stunned Port Adelaide with an 11-goal second term and went on to win a magnificent contest at Football Park yesterday.

And it was certainly timely as Glenelg was struggling towards the bottom of the premiership table and the critics were becoming more vocal.

They were silenced this time when this young, enthusiastic side displayed enormous courage and a desperate will to win against Port which was previously unbeaten this season.

Glenelg's second term was possibly the best it had displayed since Mark Williams took over as coach last year.

Williams said it was important that his players continued to believe in themselves throughout the match.

"I'm really happy for the whole club," he said. "The boys did a magnificent job."

Bradley Smith, playing only his second league game, kicked seven goals. He was strongly supported by Simon Cox playing his fifth game and Shane Fishlock who was making his league debut.

They were just a few of the youngsters who injected the Tigers with plenty of bite and have again raised the hopes of their supporters.

It would be easy to say Port simply had a bad day. Coach John Cahill certainly wasn't impressed with his team's slack defensive work in most positions and a failure to get to the ball first.

But this match was of top SANFL standard and Glenelg had to work hard for every possession.

Port, yet again, was admirably served by Tim Ginever and Stephen Williams, but it won few other positions.

The forwards had it tough because of the determined defensive work, especially from Ben Roehrich and Hamish Stuart. The ultimate mistake came seconds before time-on began in the last quarter when Port was 11 points down. Darren Smith marked less than a metre out and kicked into the man standing the mark.
