REVENGE!

Short-priced premiership favorite Port Adelaide extended its winning streak to eight by comfortably accounting for Glenelg in an uninspiring contest at Alberton Oval yesterday.

It was sweet revenge for the Magpies, who had been embarrassingly thrashed by Glenelg in round one.

Port's explosive start to the match yesterday — it kicked three goals and allowed Glenelg just two possessions in the opening four minutes — set the tone. The visitors were never able to make up the ground — even when Port lapsed into an indirect, high-risk pattern in the second and third quarters.

Only three soft goals at the finish earned Glenelg some extra respectability. Glenelg coach Tony Symonds, scathing in his criticism of his players after last week's disappointing loss to North, was in a more positive mood yesterday.

"At least we learned from last week and ran the game right out," he said. "We lost by six goals when it could have been 10 or 12." Symonds said the game was "full of errors".

Port chief John Cahill agreed the win was one of Port's least convincing of the season.

But, first to the ball, tackling strongly and running harder, it did all that was needed to win.

Port's victory was typically crafted by its half-back line. Centre half-back Paul Northeast, despite experiencing some problems when conceding inches to Paul Rouvray in the second half, was superb, as was Stephen Carter alongside him.

Carter beat Adelaide Crow Tony Hall in the first quarter, and, with Hall shifted to full forward, he blossomed as the game progressed. Teaming with Roger Delaney and Andrew McLeod who played an unfamiliar back pocket role, Carter rebounded and created with maximum effect.

Damian Angove played one of his more constructive games from a wing, Darren Smith marked strongly and hurt Glenelg at ground level while Darryl Borlase and Adrian Settre caused most damage through the midfield.

Centreman Robert West was unstoppable in the first quarter but when Symonds replaced Phil McGuinness with Dean Bailey in the second term, West's influence was dulled.

It was Symonds' switch of centre half-back Rouvray with centre half-forward Jim West which sparked a Glenelg recovery in the third quarter. When wingman Lynden Bow kicked his first goal of the match after 10 minutes of the second half Glenelg had clipped 20 points off its 34-point half-time deficit.

"But we made two errors, they kicked two goals and we were four or five goals behind again," Symonds said.

Rookie Clive Waterhouse, who spent the second quarter on the bench after a disappointing opening, played a part in each of those crucial goals.

After helping create Tim Ginever's steady goal after 12 minutes of the third quarter he marked and goaled himself to right a listing Port ship and counteract Rouvray's impact.

Glenelg half-backs Mark Viska and Simon Angove, West, Bailey and Dwaine Kretschmer battled desperately all day but Port, when threatened, had all the answers.

In the last quarter Glenelg's classy Geelong recruit Rowan Waugh rolled the suspect ankle which almost kept him out of the match.

Port turns on the power

■ PORT ADELAIDE reinforced its dominance of the SANFL with an emphatic victory over Glenelg at Alberton yesterday.

■ THE 35-point win was sweet revenge for the 92-point thrashing Port suffered at the hands of the Bays in Round One.

■ PORT'S explosive start to the match — it kicked three goals and allowed Glenelg just two possessions in the opening four minutes — set the tone for the day.

■ THE visitors were never able to make up the ground they conceded in the early stages, even when Port lapsed into an indirect, high-risk pattern in the second and third quarters.

■ PORT'S victory was typically crafted by its half-back line. Centre half-back Paul Northeast, despite experiencing some problems when conceding height to Paul Rouvray in the second half, was superb, as was Stephen Carter alongside him.

■ CARTER beat Adelaide Crow Tony Hall in the first quarter and, with Hall shifted to full forward, he blossomed as the game progressed.

■ WEST Adelaide moved to within one premiership point of the top three sides with a runaway 76-point win against Sturt at Adelaide Oval.

■ THE Bloods kicked seven unanswered goals from late in the first quarter until midway through the second to set up a matchwinning seven-goal lead at half-time.

■ NORTH Adelaide pushed, crawled and shoved its way to its fifth consecutive win against a desperate Woodville-West Torrens at Prospect yesterday.

■ A SPECTACULAR mark on the goal-line in the last minute by Brendon Parker gave North a nine-point break after a dour and tough contest in which neither side was able to break clear.

■ IN the late match, a battle-hardened and disciplined Norwood edged closer to the top three with a character-building 11-point victory over a surprisingly sluggish Central District at Football Park.
