Bays stir to flush out fade-outs

Glenelg finally gave its home crowd something to get excited about with a stirring 10-point win over Port Adelaide in the mud at The Bay.

The slogging victory is almost certainly too late to save Glenelg's season.

But it must have gone a long way to eliminating the ghosts haunting the side after several frustrating fade-outs in 1995.

This was Glenelg's first home win in the last five outings at Brighton Road, and only its second win since May 7.

Importantly, it was achieved in the toughest of conditions against a side renowned for strength all over the ground.

Glenelg midfielder Dean Bailey set the example with an inspirational 32-disposal display. He also finished it off by kicking the Tigers' final two goals to stop Port's late challenges.

But there were plenty of other players willing to throw themselves into the packs. Regular contributors Phil McGuinness and Nick Chigwidden kept pumping the ball forward, ruckman Stewart McCully refused to allow Port's Brett Chalmers to dominate, Grant Reubenicht was outstanding in a back pocket, polished rookie wingman Ben Moore kicked two brilliant goals in the third term, and half-forward Tony Hall gave Stephen Carter a headache.

Glenelg coach Tony Symonds must have been thinking "here we go again" when it jumped away to a 20-point lead in the third term but allowed Port to kick the next two goals.

But although Port had plenty of chances to close the gap in the final quarter it could not break Glenelg's resistance.

"I think it was important that we managed to

hold the lead because obviously the guys had a few doubts about themselves after the last couple of months," Symonds said.

"I felt that if we could keep our nose in front we'd be okay, but I thought if they had got another couple of goals and got the lead back we might have had that self-doubt again.

"We set ourselves for those 50/50 balls ... to hit them with a 100 per cent commitment and try to make something from nothing.

"That was always where the game was going to be won or lost," he said.

Port now must face another challenge for third place, and the double chance.

Since winning eight successive games early in the season the Magpies have won just three of the next eight games — and not one against a top five side.

"Glenelg's desire was better than ours," concerned Port coach John Cahill said.

"We had more of the ball in the second and last quarters but we couldn't convert.

"I didn't think our forward system worked too well and they scored too easily going through defence. I didn't think our defence was a tough as it should have been.

"Their players put their bodies behind the ball more than ours did. Some of our players didn't hit the ball hard enough and that was the disappointing part."

Onballer Robbie West worked hard, dropped Crow Brett Chalmers had a great duel with McCully, and David Brown made an impressive debut after missing five weeks with a fractured cheekbone.
