Determined Norwood yesterday soured Chris McDermott's unexpected Glenelg homecoming with an impressive 24-point win at The Parade.

Stung by its loss to Central District in the opening round, Norwood discovered its best form to deny former Crows captain McDermott, who was playing his first game for the Tigers since the 1990 SANFL grand final.

Sore and disappointed afterwards, McDermott was Glenelg's leading player — but all honors lay with Norwood in a wonderful match.

Glenelg, which trailed by five goals midway through the third term, closed to within 10 points seven minutes into the last quarter before Norwood snuffed out its challenge.

The victory was just reward for Neil Craig's outfit, which faces reigning premier Port Adelaide at Alberton on Saturday.

On yesterday's cool, hard-tackling display, the Redlegs should hold their own in what is invariably regarded as SA football's most daunting assignment.

McDermott, who yesterday described the standard of SANFL football as "good, open and fast although not quite as physical as AFL", was ultimately upstaged by Crow colleague Stephen Rowe. Rehabilitated after a ter-

New Redleg kicks eight goals

NORWOOD'S recruiting campaign has netted another promising interstate player.

Former Sydney Swans key forward Shayne Smith, 19, signed for the club on Friday and kicked eight goals for the Redleg reserves against Glenelg yesterday.

Smith played four AFL matches last season and is a strong-

rible knee injury, Rowe joined with dogged Gary Smallridge, Magarey medallist Garry McIntosh, Todd Davey, Jerry D'Antiochia and emergent Roger James in forming a midfield Glenelg could not overcome.

McDermott was, however, well supported by wingman Jon Symonds, defenders Grant Reubenicht and Rowan Waugh, full forward Dean Caldwell and centre half-forward Jim West as Norwood produced occasionally irresistible football.

But Glenelg's over-riding lethargy rendered it impotent against a commanding Norwood unit. Tiger coach Tony Symonds had warned his players of complacency after its 92-win over Port.

His words apparently had not been heeded. But his men were far from disgraced in one of the SANFL's more engrossing early-season encounters.

The contest, which had simmered uneasily from the outset, erupted controversially midway through the second quarter

when a behind-the-play wrestling match began in the southern goalsquare.

Involving Anthony Pierrri and Chris Primus and Jarrod Hocking and Paul Hamilton, the confrontation was interrupted briefly by a James goal.

When Jonathon Ross was freed after tangling with Hocking — before the ball had been returned to the centre of the ground — Norwood earned its second goal in 45 seconds.

Hocking was reported by field umpires Troy Burton and Richard Williams for allegedly charging.

Trailing by 20 points two minutes later, Glenelg appeared decidedly ragged before Dwaine Kretschmer and Allan Bartlett helped slash the deficit to just six points before Pierrri stretched the lead to two goals at half-time.

The sequence of events was typical of the match as Norwood sprinted before Glenelg struggled to bridge the gap. Norwood always looked safe; Glenelg always appeared a step slow.
