

If Glenelg coach Tony Symonds had his way the 2773 fans at Woodville Oval yesterday would receive a small surprise this week in the mailbox.

"I think they should go and get the name and address of every single person that was at the ground today and send them back their admission fee," Symonds said after Glenelg's faint finals hopes finally had been crushed by another side about to take an early holiday, Woodville-West Torrens. "It was the worst game of football I've seen for a long, long time."

Considering some of Glenelg's lame efforts this season, Symonds' call probably was a little off target. But it revealed his growing frustration at the failure of several Glenelg players to make any significant impact on the game - not just this week, but all season.

In the other changerooms, Eagles' coach Bruce Winter certainly was satisfied with the 22-point win their sixth success in what also has been a disappointing year, after playing in the past two grand finals.

Again ruckman David Neimann showed his value. He shared the hit-outs with Glenelg's Stewart McCully but had an enormous influence around the ground, winning 25 possessions.

Significantly, Glenelg's four goals with the wind in the first term all were scored after Niemann left the centre square for a rare rest at full forward.

The Eagles trailed by 16 points at quarter-time but added seven goals to one in the second term to knock Glenelg off its game. Rovers Rowan Thorne and Jason Sziller and centreman Paul Chapman won the testing balls, while rookie Michael Phillipou grew in stature at centre half-forward and menacing Wayne Weidemann was on hand when needed.

Tasmanian Thorne, one of the year's big improvers, continued to dominate the packs in the last half to be best afield with 40 disposals, defenders Mark Devine and Jason Spehr ruled their positions, and 250-gamer Andrew Payze exploded in the third term when Glenelg was unable to mount any challenge.

"We were a lot cleaner in close, taking it on the first grab," Winter said. "Because of that we had blokes in the correct position to receive and that worked pretty well.

"We set out to improve certain areas of our game, to have players trying to commit for a full four quarters, and if you've got enough blokes thinking along the same lines the result looks after itself."

Tony Hall clearly was Glenelg's best player at halfforward - and in his current form and fitness it is hard to understand why he can't win back a regular spot with the Adelaide Crows.

Crows team-mate Matthew Kluzek was Hall's shadow but the former Hawthorn and SA star emerged the winner, picking up 25 possessions, taking 12 marks and kicking three goals.

Midfielders Paul Hallahan, Dean Bailey and Nick Chigwidden were the best of the rest but they – unlike their Eagle counterparts – were left to do nearly all the dirty work. If Symonds is the Bays' coach next season - and

there seems no reason to blame him for some of his players' shortcomings - expect some major changes at Brighton Road. "Our problem all year has been that we leave too much work to about four of five blokes .. they can't do it for us all year," Symonds said. "It's ridiculous. You've got to look at your reasons for being involved in the game, for playing league football. Do you just want to chalk up games or do you want to accomplish something with your league career?"
