Major Sturt setback: Feast faces knee surgery

Bays find lost form

Glenetg finally ended its horror four-game losing streak with a scrappy but promising 51-point victory over a desperate Sturt in the AFL curtain-raiser at Football Park yesterday.

Glenelg's solid 20.11 (131) to 12.8 (80) win also brought more troubles to the Blues with star ruckman and State squad member Simon Feast likely to have knee surgery this week.

Feast, who came into the game with a chronic left knee problem, lined-up at full forward and struggled throughout the often scrambly affair before coming off after falling heavily late in the game while rucking.

Glenelg was too desperate and too skilful for the Blues.

Midfielders Lynden Bow, Simon Hele, Nick Chigwidden, Jon Symonds and follower Chris McDermott simply had too much of the ball and too much time to use it effectively.

A lack-lustre first half resulted in more ball-handling errors than the mini-league match. Glenelg scratched back the ascendancy in the second term, as the lead changed five times, then produced a 13.6 to 6.4 last half - indicating it is slowly getting back on the rails.

"I don't think there should be any headlines saying Glenelg's back because we've just won one game and it's a platform where you can improve and go on from if you're focused," said Gleneig coach Tony Symonds.

"We're back in the driver's seat but we haven't gone anywhere yet."

Veteran Glenelg goalsneak Jim West proved a matchwinner with 5.1 and always provided an attacking focus. He was Glenelg's only clear forward winner in the first half but when Mark Soderstrom (3.1) and Mark Tylor (3.0) broke into the game the Tigers stormed home.

Defender Ben Thompson and Grant Reubenicht rebounded strongly and Stewart McCully (21 hit-outs) and Ben Roehrich. in a rare appearance in ruck, dominated the taps.

Quite simply, Sturt's mistakes cost it the two premier-

ship points.

"In the first three quarters we had the ball in our scoring zone more than they did but we didn't have the players to finish it off," said Sturt coach Phil Carman.

"We haven't got a full forward to kick three or four goals a game. The skills were disappointing. Glenelg had four or five disposals linked together but we have an inability because we have only one or two and then break down. If we could have more of that going into our forward lines we could kick more goals."

Carman said losing Bruce Lennon before the game, injured at State training on Wednesday, reflected badly on Sturt's man-power.

The pace picked up after halftime and both teams threw their bodies in wildly, particularly Glenelg half-back Mark Viska whose vigorous approach attracted harsh words from umpire Ron Bettridge and Sturt's Brodie Atkinson.

The Blues follower, almost unsighted in the opening quarter, finished with 26 possessions and with Ben Nelson and lightning-quick Damien Obst stimulated Sturt. Brad Hall was the best big man on the field and dominated at half-forward even after Alan Bartlett moved on to him and the much shorter Luke Ottens went to the back pocket to mind Stephen White.

SANFL debutant Mark Pitura (ex-Collingwood) blitzed Glenelg with pace and aggression early, before fading through lack of match fitness.
