to break through the pain and offer second and third efforts.

First-season coach Wayne Stringer recognised Glenelg had moments worth remembering but said he could not accept a draw when the Bays clearly had opportunities to bury the Panthers.

Five-game rookie James Tamblyn tagged South's Chris Wittman out of the game in the first half then shifted onto the ultra-damaging Sampson, who had cut Glenelg to ribbons with his fearless approach and superlative

Defender Dean Talbot (27) mopped up cleverly in defence, but was too loose when Chad Cornes came on in the forward pocket in the second term. Diminutive South rover Mark Ryan's approach was inspirational, Trent Hotton was creative at full forward and Phil Murton continued his recent top form.

While South lacked spark when the game was up for grabs and the scores tied at the start of the final quarter it refused to give in.

"The spirit in that last quarter was just unbelievable," coach Ken Applegarth said. "Overall we just made a lot of unforced errors which just makes it twice as hard for ourselves.

"I think we 'lost' the game be-cause of our lack of skill. The thing I'm happy about is that they fought on when they could have fallen away."
