PORT Adelaide is primed for a major assault on Norwood when third and second clash in the match-of-the-round on Friday night at The Parade.

Port coach Stephen Williams said the Magpies, sitting nicely at 7-4, had strung together solid wins in preparation for the tough Norwood encounter. Williams was satisfied with the Magpies' win over a dogged Glenelg, but cited the side's victory over the Bloods two weeks ago as a definitive win.

"We dropped a couple at Alberton early that we should have won, but the last two weeks have been very encouraging," he said.

"I felt the win over West was a good one and on Saturday West showed they are as good as anyone in the competition."

Port Adelaide, pushed by the Tigers until half-time, asserted its dominance by the final siren with 27 scoring shots to 11.

Williams could not be happier with the work-rate and polish of Power-listed wingman, Peter Burgoyne, who picked up 15 kicks, four marks and eight handballs in a definitive four-quarter display. Fellow Power player David Brown (18 disposals), shared the honors with the Tigers' Nick Chigwidden in the first half, but the hard-working on-baller dominated in the second half while Chigwidden faded. Port was at its awesome best in the third term with the wind, moving the ball from defence into attack with cruel efficiency and scoring 5.4 to nothing.

Evans, apart from poor kicking (4.6), had a field day and Darren Smith, coming off the bench, imposed his will in the forward line

immediately. Glenelg - desperate to hit back early in the final quarter - received a kick-start with a goal from Chad Cornes after a blistering pass from Lance Picioane.

But the next goal, after 14 minutes of rebounding between the half-back lines, came from the boot of Evans, who toe-poked the ball over the line after a brilliant run and pass from Brown. The full forward kicked another goal, finishing off some crisp work out of the centre, and any faint hopes of a Glenelg revival were dead and buried.

Williams said Richard Ambrose, forced to pull out before the match with a bout of food poisoning, would be fit for Friday. He said Scott Hodges, named among the reserves' best, could come under scrutiny for the Norwood clash.

"He will come under consideration but in a night game, when it is wet and slippery, it might be better to give him another run in the reserves and look at the next game against South," Williams said.

Glenelg coach Tony McGuinness said the Tigers, after a solid first term, failed to capitalise on their chances when they kicked with the wind in the second quarter. On the plus side, McGuinness said he was happy with the performance of rookies Benjamin McEntee, Michael Oldfield and Scott Flett.

"Given where we are at, we will persist with the youth policy," McGuinness said. "We played 11 under-19 guys in our seconds today. We will continue to promote blokes and come home well in the second half of the season."
