

OUTH Adelaide made a mockery of its bottom of the ladder status to open its account for the season by trouncing dispirited Glenelg in every key feature of football and win by 29 points yesterday at Noarlunga.

South's 14.15 (99) to 10.10 (70) victory did not convey the full extent of control the Panthers had on proceedings. Best-afield Trent Mills. Andrew Osborn and star ruckman Simon Crawshay dominated the centre, defenders Dean Talbot, Ian Perrie, Kym Cobb, Nathan Genovese and Matthew Bryant launched repeated attacks and forwards Peter Johnson, David Hams and high-leaping sensation Ryan Fitzgerald were too creative and hungry for their slow-reacting opponents.

South led from the first minute and won every key position – with the possible exception of centre half-back, where Allan Bartlett was competitive. But South displayed the skills and system of a finals outfit and outstripped Glenelg South 14.15 (99) d Gleneig 10.10 (70)

for toughness with relentless run and focus on the ball, which produced its own luck. Granite-tough Mills made

full use of Crawshay's dominance in the centre and around the ground and repeatedly ran off the 200cm ex-Hawthorn big man to create endless opportunities for South's attack. Crawshay won 20 effective hit-outs and the entire Glenelg team managed only 13 against him.

Rangy and strong overhead from goal-to-goal, the Panthers could easily have won by more if not for poor kicking for goal.

When the Tigers needed a huge lift in intensity and desire they failed badly in the last quarter, when they trailed by 21 points coming home with the aid of a stiff breeze.

Glenelg went in without Richard Kelly (leg) and lost ruckman Wayne Thornborrow (foot), Michael Raidis (bruised bottock) and its key generator Alistair Burke (knee) by halftime but angry coach Tony McGuinness would not accept excuses for the dismal effort. He spoke to his team for 30 minutes after the game and later said the scoreboard flattered Glenelg, which had been totally beaten.

"That wasn't an honest effort. I think (South) killed us with endeavor, they killed us with attack on the football and they killed us with use of the football," he said.

"If the basic fundamentals are attacking the football and using the football we didn't do it and they did. As a team we weren't up to it and it's my responsibility to do something about it.

"Having been in the position a couple of times as a player I'm going to have to delve into the past and see how to play it.

"It's going to require a lot of heart and we are going to have to sort through the process to see if our players are just potentially good."


No longer hesitant or indirect, South has good players in key positions and the electrifying Fitzgerald, 21, is set to drag spectators through the Noarlunga gates with his sensational aerial prowess. Standing 196cm he thrashed Chad Cornes (193cm) early and took 10 eye-catching grabs, despite being slightly subdued by Damien Gigney in the third term. Fitzgerald capped off a brilliant display with 2.2.

South coach Ken Applegarth has held his beliefs against all criticism and said his much-maligned team has showed signs it is unfolding a new style.

"The club now has the work ethic and the right personnel - we've just got to work hard," he said. "I wanted those guys to enjoy their footy . . . instead of getting whacked every time.

"Now they can understand they have got a bit of flair in their game but they also understand the things we're trying to work. We can get a bit of a structure now . . . this (win) gives us such a good foundation. We just wanted it more."


