Glenelg coach Tony McGuinness was left to lament another game where the Tigers (1-6) were in front in the last quarter, but fell short.

But he was pleased with the Tigers' ability to close down Sturt's danger players after being hopelessly outplayed in the first term and finding themselves down 0.2 to 3.6 at quartertime.

But the Double Blues will look for a lift across the board for Friday night's blockbuster against Port at Adelaide Oval.


