Bays building up

LENELG put its season back on track against hapless North Adelaide on Saturday and could have three key players back for Friday night's acid test against Norwood.

Exciting East Fremantle import Martin Mellody, experienced defender Paul Rouvray and Powerlisted forward Chad Cornes could bolster the Tiger unit in a bid to build on the momentum gained from its 40-point victory over the Roosters at Prospect.

Glenelg coach Tony McGuinness said Mellody, who has missed five games with a hamstring strain, was a strong chance of moving straight into the seniors, while Cornes, ruled out on Wednesday after being concussed against West Adelaide, would play unless required by the Power.

He rated Rouvray, who had a knee arthroscopy three weeks ago, a 50-50 chance.

"We probably have some good talent coming back, but the important thing is to keep playing like we did today, with the passion and intensity," said McGuinness, whose only injury concern from the game is defender Mark Viska (corked thigh).

McGuinness also had reason to smile about the rookie performances of Ben Physick, who worked hard and effectively across halfforward in his second game for the club, and compact Craig Healey, who joined the Bays from the ACT Rams and showed poise and ten-

acity when given a run off the bench.

Another bonus was the senior comeback of Crows-listed Lance Picioane, who swooped on a loose ball to nail the Tigers' opening goal to kick-start a classy display tarnished only by some wayward disposal.

"He has played seconds for a long time and we and the Crows have been talking to him and I get the feeling he has matured over the past couple of months.

"Before that he was not working hard enough and not doing the job for Glenelg. But he was very good on Saturday," McGuinness said.

With injury, AFL duty and plain bad form combining to bring about the Tigers' slump, McGuinness knew

Saturday's match was an absolute must-win situation - particularly with Central District making its spirited charge for the five. "There is very little between most of the sides. no more than five or 10 per cent maximum between all of them, and on the day I believe we are good enough to beat anyone," he said.

The real positive for Glenelg was the size of the victory, with the team's 16 goals matching its tally for the previous three games.

McGuinness tried regular full back Paul Sherwood at full forward early and then switched defender Damien Gigney to full forward, where the bustling spearhead accepted laser-like passes damaging from crumbers Sudjai Cook, Picioane and Nick Chigwidden.

The Tigers, after cracking the game open with six goals to one in the third term, were back to the sharpness which rattled Woodville-West Torrens in round 10.

For North Adelaide, it was a first half full of hope only to be deflated by a dismal fade-out in the third quarter which left coach Chris McDermott fuming.

The Roosters now stay anchored at second-bottom and will crash to wooden-spoon favoritism if it loses against South at Noarlunga this week.
