Pressure takes toll on Eagles

LENELG'S grinding 23-point win over Woodville-West Torrens said more about the Eagles than Glenelg.

Everybody must by now know the Tigers can, and often do, win under pressure. But when the heat was on in a wet second half on Saturday the Eagles looked decidedly ragged. They played as if they could not handle the close-in body pressure slippery conditions always bring. They were lightweight and incapable of clean skills and it was no surprise Glenelg powered to the 12.7 (79) to 8.8 (56) win.


Glenelg dominated after half-time with 23 more disposals, having broken about even on the possession count in a free-flowing and entertaining first half. The win was all heart - especially from reliable Richard Kelly (29 disposals, three effective tackles), Nick Chigwidden (26 disposals), who is still "Nippy Nick" despite his 30 years, Alistair Burke (20) and hard-working Lance Picioane, who laid seven effective tackles and outmuscled the Eagles.

"If you've got players who can win the footy and are hard around the footy it gives you a lot of opportunities to win a game," coach Tony McGuinness said. Simple and true.

The Eagles - restricted to a dismal 1.3 in the second half are better than they demonstrated. But they failed in a crucial match which could have had them sitting clear in third spot. Instead, Glenelg took the slot and the Eagles slipped to fifth as quickly as the two points slid through their fingers on Saturday.

It faces a reviving North Adelaide at Prospect next week in a fight for finals survival, while Sturt and West Adelaide battle for the same prize - not the best scenario with four minor rounds remaining.

"Our accountability was a concern, even early," coach Mark Mickan said. "In the first quarter we went into the attacking 50 metres 15 times for

"North have been competitive for a couple of weeks against quality opposition. They'd have to start favorite the way we played," he said.
