# Bays prove they are for real

LENELG'S 50-point demolition of Port Adelaide on Saturday puts the other finals aspirants on notice the Tigers have a game style capable of rocking any team.

But the crushing win - highlighted by an impressive second half in which Glenelg kicked 10 goals to two prompted Port coach Stephen Williams to warn his players they were now fighting to hold their spots in the side. A disgusted Williams labelled Port's second half as "pathetic" - and he was right. He hinted only the fully committed would be asked to wear the black-andwhite jumper again.

Not only did Glenelg beat Port with skills, pace and efficiency, it also dented the Magpies' reputation as being kings of crunch. Put simply, Glenelg beat the more fancied Magpies at their own game.

"Perhaps it's better a few of them show their colors now than in two week," Williams said. "It was always going to be a tough contest. If you lose by two goals you can probably get some positives but there wasn't one (Port) player I could say did anything ... you don't play like that and get

away with it. We were pretty good against Norwood last week and maybe a few of them thought they were better than they are. All of a sudden they got found out by some desperate players from Glenelg."

Glenelg's Josh Carr eventually tagged David Brown out of the game - although the umpires helped Carr's cause by ignoring his close checking at ball-ups even before the ball was put to ground. Richard Kelly and the, at times, genius Nick Chigwidden dominated the midfield, under-rated Alistair Burke cut out Aaron Fiora and makeshift ruckman Todd Winstanley - who replaced Brooke Fogden (knee) after 90 seconds proved more than a handful.

The Tigers were fundamentally tougher - even when Port fought its way into the pressure game with a 4.3 to 3.3 second term - and powered to what Tony McGuinness said was its best win in his two seasons as coach.

Glenelg was confident and its ability to produce clean skills under immense body pressure was the difference. Martin Mellody (hamstring), Simon Hele (shoulder), Paul Rouvray (calf/knee) and per-

haps Matthew Golding claimed by Adelaide on Friday might come in this week to face Sturt at Unley.

"I think it's an example of the spirit of the team that we're able to bring players in to the side and they're able to do the job because they understand the feel of the side and they feel confident," coach Tony McGuinness said. "We have tidied up in the midfield and cut out the over-use of the ball. I'd like to think our guys were desperate to win and that creates opportunities - and we used most of them."

McGuinness said Glenelg had reached a defining moment in its season which has already produced much improvement. Now it is time to step up to another level.

"Beating Port and Sturt would be the thing to take us to another level, then obviously play in the finals. The first step was to beat Port in the defining point to be able to step to that level - and we did it well," he said. "Sturt are a good side but the good thing is we're ready to take them on."

Glenelg has the depth to be a force in the finals, especially if it earns the double chance.
