

True Blue grit in fight for top three

TURT and Glenelg are locked in a tight tussle for the double chance in this year's finals after the Double Blues' bruising 18-point victory at Unley Oval on Saturday.

After going at it for four quarters in a physical, seesawing game, the two teams go their separate ways for the SANFL's last minor round, but will still be fighting each other to see which team will grab a crucial top-three position.

Sturt takes on Port Adelaide at Alberton Oval and may have to make the trek down Port Road without Tim Weatherald (broken hand), Damian Squire (neck), Matthew Powell (back) and Andrew Geddes (foot), who were all injured on Saturday. The Tigers play revitalised West Adelaide at Richmond, with the Bloods playing to keep their finals chances alive.

With Sturt and Glenelg now locked on 12 wins for the season, the race for the top. three will go right to the wire. "Now we've got to go to

Richmond next week to try to get back into the top three - Sturt 13.13 (91) d Gleneig 10.13 (73)

it's big for us, big for them," Glenelg coach Tony McGuinness said. "I guess the good thing about that is one team will want to win more than the other and I'd expect to see us come out pretty hard and play the kind of footy we had been in the past six weeks."

For two quarters against the Blues on Saturday, Glenelg did show some of the form which had rocketed it to second position going into round 22, outscoring the home side by four goals in the middle two quarters. But the damage had already been done by midway through the second quarter, when Sturt, playing some of the best football of the season, had stormed to a 46-point lead.


With ruckman Tom Waltham playing his best game for the club, according to coach Phil Carman, a rebounding, miserly defence led by Seamus Maloney and Mark Soderstrom and a winning forward in Dean Woosnam, the Double Blues looked set for a percentageboosting win.

But as injury exposed the

Sturt midfield, and McGuinness successfully swung sixth-gamer Lindsay Smith into the ruck to counter Waltham, Glenelg worked its way back into the game and was just seven points behind at the final break. But Woosnam kicked the first goal of the last term and Sturt controlled the first 15 minutes to secure an important victory, one which saw it replace the Tigers in the top three. "I was still confident at three-quarter time that we could take it out, but the message was as simple as the double chance was there, it was a matter of which team wanted

it more," Carman said. "After the first quarter we played, I was hopeful we could reproduce another quarter like that."

Paul Sherwood was Glenelg's best, resolute on the last line of defence and Sudjai Cook, Brett Higgins and Alistair Burke won plenty of the ball without always hurting the Blues with their possessions.
