off some of our players," McGuinness said. "I don't think we would have had one player tagged last year but it's now starting to happen.

"They're going to be coming at us and they're not going to let us do what we want so we've got to be able to absorb that."

Glenelg led by only three goals early in the last term but produced better skills when needed to kick four unanswered goals in a 10-minute burst to sink South, which is simply not doing the tough stuff which made it more than competitive last season.

It seemed many players believed they were more gifted than facts reveal. SA's 203cm under-18 State squad ruckman Stephen Doyle, 17, however, showcased his emormous potential, outrucking Crows' teenage star Matthew Golding and outmarking everybody. Doyle moved to half-forward later and was less effective.

Ashley Fernee, Scott Webb, Trent Mills, Kym Cobb, Derek Murray, suffering the 'flu, and Jon Tumes never stopped trying but South was always under pressure in attack because of poor ball-handling and a failure to protect the ball-carriers.

Coach Ken Applegarth inherited a team that had lost its spirit but he thought he had transformed the Panthers into a competitive and ruthless unit. Now, however, he said it was "shattering" for every Panther fan to see it again on the bottom of the ladder.

"It's that word confidence," he said. "Our game plan is still the same and we're doing the same things at training (but) they've really dropped off in the last two weeks. We've got to go back to basics. I'm looking for blokes who are prepared to work for four quarters. Guys have to be working off the ball. We want guys to be a lot more offensive and try to create but that doesn't mean you don't do the hard work. They've got to be accountable as well."

Applegarth said he had been "patient and supportive" but too many were not playing up to last season's standard.

His patience has run out.
