THE maxim says knowledgeable coaches learn more from a loss than a bagful of free-running victories.

If Glenelg's Tony McGuinness subscribes to that theory he is now pondering exactly what he found out about his charges after Central District gave them a mild spanking at Elizabeth on Satur-

The 17-point margin was not a thumping but it did expose several Tigers who did not stand up in skills and application. Central had to fight back after

being a handful of points down three times in a scrappy and lowscoring game. But that it was able to do so must be a worry for Glenelg.

The Tigers' midfielders had enough of the ball to do damage but even their early dominance could not excite any Glenelg forward enough to get seriously involved. Veteran Allan Bartlett, 31, with three goals and five marks was the best but Ben McEntee and Lindsay Smith and Damian Gigney, who both spent more time on the bench than in play, took just two marks between them.


Central squeezed out Glenelg's runners - although follower James Byrne (29 disposals) was again unstoppable – and did not allow it to establish the open running and clean skills it used to kill off North Adelaide, West Adelaide, Norwood and South Adelaide in consecutive weeks.

But when the tables were turned some Tigers showed signs of frustration and could not shut down the Central push. McGuinness noted his mob did well at the bottom of packs but Central cleaned up on anything loose.

"We're not going to know what we learned from this until we play next," he said.

Probably, we have to look at a couple of personnel who didn't quite come up under the pressure. It's very well to play in a winning side but it's what you do under pressure, particularly in a tight last quarter like this, which tells what standing you're at."

There is no need to panic. The loss did not effect Glenelg's second place on the ladder and

with about a dozen senior players due back from injury, including Martin Mellody (hamsting) and Matthew Liptak (calf), it can only improve.

Central, too, has good days anead. Damien Arnold (22 disposals, nine marks and 23 hitouts) gave Rick Macgowan, Danny Hulm and Marco Bello a ide, Jason Wozniak was sharp on a wing after replacing Murray Hamlin (hamstring) and its defence was strong.

But without Mark Conway (hamstring) at half-forward, Central struggled to get the ball into the scoring zone. Conway will go back to half-forward but it is Central's fight and workrate that has the fans smiling.

"I said to them if we just keep working, the game would crack open and in the last quarter it did," coach Peter Jonas said. "Once we manned-up we got a contest.

"It was never going to be pretty from then but we got the points." Central has 10 injured players and had to play two under-19s in the reserves but Conway, Tim Cook (knee) and Simon Luhrs (back) should be fit to face South Adelaide in its next match on June 11. Michael Wakelin (knee) is doubtful.
