FOOTY MONDAY

Pride of Bay takes battering

GLENELG surrendered more than two premiership points in its 16-point loss to North Adelaide at Prospect Oval on Saturday. It also lost some pride.

Pride was on the line for both clubs. The Tigers spoke about it through the week and Neil Kerley addressed the Roosters on Friday night. North coach Chris McDermott described the game as pivotal in the club's history - such was its importance.

"I have great respect and admiration for Kerls and, in his style, he was pretty blunt but the message really sunk in," McDermott said. "His final words were 'you'll win tomorrow' and they came here with that firmly in their minds and they played like winners all day." Glenelg coach Tony McGuinness said: "We spoke about pride, getting off the bottom. We saw it as a winnable game and approached it with plenty of confidence right up until those undisciplined errors... then the momentum swung."

And the issue was not just that Glenelg lost but how it lost.

Two decisive passages unfolded five minutes into the final term. Glenelg held its three quarter-time lead of nine points at the time. First, Cameron Venables arrived very late on the scene to bump Roosters rover Ben Setchell off his kick. The incident happened on the members' wing and a free kick was relayed downfield to give North a shot at goal.

The Roosters converted and Venables was benched. Just moments later Glenelg captain Nick Chigwidden applied a crude tackle on best-on-ground Scott Sutherland, 70 metres from North's goal. Chigwidden back-chatted the umpire, a 25-metre penalty was issued and Sutherland converted from directly in front. Chigwidden too was dragged.

The North crowd willed McGuinness to

deal the same treatment to Chigwidden, as he did to Venables. Chigwidden was one of Glenelg's best and with one kick the difference, North was pleased to see the back of him. The Roosters' confidence soared and the Tigers' morale momentarily was dented.

"It's disgraceful, it shouldn't happen," McGuinness said. "It doesn't matter who it is, doesn't matter when it is. If they're going to do their own thing and be undisciplined, they're going to come off the ground."

McDermott empathised. "I understand Tony's dilemma and I've been in the situation where I've had to do it myself," he said. "That situation is so demoralising for them and having to take guys off the ground upsets the team balance and harmony and makes our team grow." Glenelg, however, recovered from the situation through the class of James Byrne (two quick goals) and then a running goal to Matthew Bode to regain the lead.

But it was short-lived.

The Roosters' vision of victory became reality as they booted another four goals to Glenelg's one. Danny Morton pushed the ball forward at every opportunity, Sutherland continued his total dominance, so too Cameron Roberts and Lucas Herbert attacked the marking contests with vigor, providing a clear target at centre half-forward.

Glenelg had played in brilliant bursts with effective individual contributions at different stages from Mark Harwood, Ben Moore, Byrne, Simon Hele, Chigwidden and Bode. It scored quick, running goals in contrast to North's more methodical - and in the first half inaccurate - scoring attempts.

Harwood's four-straight goals had been the difference between the sides before half-time. But Roosters backman Mark Hollitt, who shut down David Hams and the first half, then nullified Harwood. Neither Hams nor Harwood could win a kick on the defender.
