McDermott roasts Roosters

ERRIBLE, disgraceful and deplorable are not words senior football coaches are often prone to use to describe their team's performance - certainly not outside the privacy of a dressing down in the locker rooms after a game.

But they are the words North Adelaide coach Chris McDermott used to describe his Roosters after their match against Glenelg at the Bay on Saturday . . . and he had every reason to do so.

Glenelg did not so much win its opening game of season 2000 as did North lose it. From the opening bounce the Roosters showed barely a trace of the intensity and desperation for the ball expected of a firstgrade outfit. They ambled after the ball, were brushed aside in what should have been hard-hitting contests and showed little desperation in seizing the loose ball. When it did get the ball, North's disposal was most often woeful - full of wobbly tumble punts and off-target handballs. Some of the inaccuracies can be attributed to the intensity of the pressure applied by the aggressive Bays, but certainly not all.

McDermott said the only excuse possible for his players - and he allowed very little room for it - was their shorter six-day rest after their punishing draw with South

Adelaide in round one. Calling it only a "silly chance" that the Roosters were within striking distance (11 points) at three-quarter time, McDermott said that scoreline was entirely dependant on the miserly defence of Ray Ebel and


Scott Sutherland, who he ranked as his only perfomers. There was another reason for the tight scoreline, however. North reached its attacking 50m area far less than the Tigers but did convert a higher percentage of its opportunities. When Scott Leal drilled the second of his two goals for the third term shortly before the final break the margin was down to five points and it seemed, however unlikely, the Roosters could charge into the final term with a genuine sniff of victory. A late goal by Mark Harwood pushed the margin back out to 11 points and, in the final term, Glenelg finally pulled away with five goals to two to win by 32 points.

The hallmark of Glenelg's win was its aggression and desperation for the football and, typically, this was best exemplified by tenacious captain Nick Chigwidden.

The win was a fitting reward for Chigwidden as he celebrated the start of his eighth year as captain at Bay Oval, a record in Tigerland.

Describing the captaincy record as "a great honor for a great player", coach Tony McGuinness said it was Chigwidden's gritty persistence that set the tone for Glenelg's uncompromising attack on the ball.

Chigwidden's work around the ground was complemented by the quick, classy disposals of Richard Kelly while Ben McEntee combined spectacular marking with hard running and bodywork in attack and defence.

Mills accumulated an impressive 39 disposals in South Adelaide's win over West Adelaide.


Cicolella, runner-up in last year's award, continued his impressive form with a best-afield performance against Sturt on Saturday.
