# Roosters fight on

NORTH Adelaide has kept alive its hopes of avoiding the wooden spoon with a fighting 23-point victory over Glenelg at Prospect Oval yesterday.

The win was just the third for the Roosters this season, but importantly has helped them climb to within one point of Glenelg on the premiership ladder.

North will face Sturt and Norwood in the last two rounds, while Glenelg's only remaining commitment is against West Adelaide next week. The Tigers have the bye in the last round.

It was a win of tremendous character with the Roosters forced to retrieve a third-quarter deficit after Glenelg appeared set to surge away with the premiership points.

The contest was a muddy slog with North gaining the early ascendancy. Promising youngster Mark Jamar dominated the ruck to continually push the ball forward.

The beneficiaries of his work were Tim Cook, Chris Ladhams and skipper Scott Sutherland.

Until half-time the home side had all the answers, securing a threegoal break as it reaped the rewards of a tireless effort.

Glenelg found some spark in the ruck with Bradley Smith taking control, as the Tigers were able to sweep the ball forward.

Matthew Bode, in and out of the game in the first half, created havoc in the forward line to bag three goals. Phillip McKenzie, Ben McEntee, Martin Mellody and Malcolm Greenwood were prominent as Glenelg piled on 5.4.

But the Tigers' effort was just a tease for supporters, North regaining composure to shut out its opponent.

The last quarter was played in the Roosters' forward line with Daniel Hargraves becoming a strong focal point in attack. And when Glenelg did go forward it was held up by Adam Morgan.

"We probably went backwards today," Glenelg coach Brenton Honor lamented.

"We have been improving and been very competitive, especially against the good sides.

"To come up against the bottom side in the competition and lose is shattering. I didn't contemplate losing today. You are not going to win too many games of footy playing one quarter."
