Bays 'were hungrier'

SOUTH Adelaide coach Greg Anderson was understandably shattered with his charges' endeavour - or lack of it - against Glenelg at Noarlunga Oval on Saturday.

A week after being thumped by Central District, Anderson would have expected - or at the very least hoped - his side would come out fighting in the first term, determined to exert some authority on the match. Instead, the lethargic Panthers made the game a spectator sport, watching their opponents attack the ball ferociously. Glenelg booting six goals to two to create a decisive four-goal opening-term buffer.

It was only the third opening quarter Glenelg had won this season and for South - which had kicked a total of just seven goals in the two previous matches - represented a nightmare start to a game Anderson had built up in the week as an opportunity to bounce back.

The 15-point final margin flattered South which, despite showing patches of form and getting within one goal of Glenelg in the second quarter, never really looked like winning.

Glenelg had control of the stoppages - despite Brendon Lade re-appearing in a South guernsey for the first time since the Power's inception - with Adam Contessa, Nathon Irvin, James Byrne and Kym Koster easily winning plenty of the ball.

When South did venture forward it was often short-circuited by half-back Matthew Shir, who gathered 30

possessions and gave the Bays tireless run out of defence. In attack, Marcus Baldwin (five goals and five marks) and debutant David Yeomans (two goals, seven marks) looked dangerous in the air and on the lead, while Nathan Woods (1.4), Ben Moore (two goals) and Irvin (three goals) run amok when the ball went to ground. Combined, the quintet kicked 13 of Glenelg's 14 majors.

"They certainly came out a lot hungrier than we did," Anderson said. "After last week (losing by 195 points), you don't know how much that will affect the players the next week - but we knew this would be a good contest and built ourselves up for that. Who knows how hard it is to get over a game like last week?"

"I think about 75 per cent of our players contributed and we had about three or four who were passengers... whereas I don't think they carried anyone."

"It's very disappointing that we weren't as hungry as our opposition. Hunger is a skill and one which we must develop."

Glenelg had lost its past 14 matches away from Brighton Road - a streak dating back to Round 20, 2000 when it beat North - and its last six against South Adelaide.

The Tigers also made nine changes - seven unforced - to the side that lost to West Adelaide seven days earlier and were facing a South side bolstered with Power ruckman Lade and strong-marking Crow Ian Perrie.

"The changes we made were based on form," Glenelg coach Brenton Honor said. "We were introducing players into the side who are in form and confident."

"By making those changes we are keeping the players who are in form in the side because they are playing well and combining the two groups. That's the reason why we did it and to make a statement to a few of the other players."
