T took until its 80th - and last - quarter of the season but Glenelg finally put it all together against South Adelaide at Glenelg Oval on Saturday.

The result was emphatic, a withering five-goal burst which set up the Tigers' third win of the season, an 18-point result which snapped an 11-game losing streak.

After spluttering through much of the year, Gleneig had a structure which looked dangerous - Brad Smith competing well in ruck, James Byrne, Craig Robinson and Ben Moore winning the ball in the midfield and Matthew Manfield and Paul Sherwood providing targets up forward. As a result, the Tigers played with a confidence which had been lacking for so much of the season.

"The last quarter was fantastic - it was probably the most dominant quarter we'd had for a long time, so that was pleasing," Glenelg coach Brenton Honor said.
