Hargraves proves the difference

THE strong hands of Daniel Hargraves proved the difference as North Adelaide found clear avenues into attack and Glenelg dissolved into indecisive play at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

North charged away early, allowed Glenelg to close the gap in the second term then slammed the door shut in a controversial, decisive third quarter to win by 39 points, 19.12 (126) to 13.9 (87).

Hargraves flexed his muscles in the first term, proving too strong for youngster Craig Tasborski to score two goals in as many minutes to start a string of five unanswered goals in only eight minutes.

Glenelg's game was far more sloppy than it was when it beat Port Adelaide last week but the Roosters clearly had the better of the umpiring decisions, picking up eight free kicks to one in the first term and 23 to six for the match.

Trailing by 22 points at the first break, the Tigers were soon staring at a bleak afternoon as Andrew Moritz goaled after a sloppy turnover in the centre and then Hargraves nailed his third within the first three minutes of the second quarter.

Then the home side seized on the intensity it has been developing and hit back, scoring the next five goals through David Willett, Phillip McKenzie, Kelvin Maher and Marcus Baldwin.

Glenelg coach Brenton Honour moved experienced Paul Sherwood onto Hargraves after half-time and to great effect as the spearhead scored only two goals in the third term and none in the last.

Continuing his impressive form from last week, Matthew Shir ran off the half-back line to goal early in the third term to bring the margin down to two points to keep the contest boiling but soon after the wheels fell off the Glenelg wagon and North steamed away.

Heath Younie booted two goals in 40 seconds then five

minutes later grabbed his third as a scuffle on North's half-forward line won him a 25m penalty for a walk-in goal. To Glenelg's dismay, the scuffle continued on the walk back to the centre bounce and the umpires awarded North another shot at goal on the goal line.

Hargraves calmly booted his fifth and North had the game by the throat.

Three more goals to one for the rest of the term and an even-money match had become a 38-point procession as the Tiger heads dropped.

"That was the end of our game," Honour said. "They

had their hearts ripped out and they did not respond."

North coach Darel Hart said his side's discipline through the third stanza was "sensational" and the heart of their win along with direct movement of the ball into attack by the likes of Scott Bamford, Moritz, Chris Ladhams and captain Darryl Wintle where, in Hargraves, they had a strong target.

Both sides maintained an open, fast and aggressive style of play but the game was marked by sloppy, uncertain disposals that resulted in frequent turnovers.
