# Tigers keep finals hopes alive

GLENELG has leapfrogged South Adelaide on the premiership table after claiming a 22-point victory over the Panthers at Noarlunga Oval yesterday.

A dominant third quarter enabled the Tigers to grab their fourth win of the season and maintain its hope of a finals berth.

South coach Greg Anderson lamented some undisciplined football which he said cost the side a win.

"We certainly had enough of the ball but we cost ourselves dearly with some undisciplined acts," he said.

"In the third quarter we gave away four free kicks in front of goal and lost by three and a half goals."

Glenelg opened with a strong breeze at its back but was constantly denied by a resolute South defence, led by Kym Cobb, Ben Newberry and Aidan Parker.

The Panther defensive line stuck to a disciplined game plan, punching the ball rather than chance the odds and mark.

With the slippery conditions making ball handling difficult, the South backmen were prepared to kick the ball off the ground to get it moving forward.

minutes to kick its first goal via a 70m effort from Michael Raidis which skidded through - was testimony of the committed South defensive work.

Former Central District and Norwood forward Jarred Cotton made his debut for the Panthers as a late inclusion for the injured Greg Chapman.

He made an immediate impact, kicking a vital goal against the wind after nine minutes.

If Glenelg was guilty of not using the ball efficiently with the wind advantage then South repeated the effort in the second quarter.

The Panthers rarely took the direct passage to goal and often took the wrong option.

The Tigers midfield, which included Adelaide Crow Matthew Bode, William Neely and Brett Backwell, a star for South Australia against Western Australia last week. started to get heavily involved and take control of proceedings. Given the conditions, there was always going to be plenty of packs and scrappy football.

Glenelg, however, was able to put together some more

that proved the difference.

Despite having five fewer scoring shots, the home side was just five points down at half-time and still very much in the match.

However, two undisciplined acts which coughed up goals within minutes to open the third quarter would have been disheartening for the Panthers.

Firstly Neely goaled after two 25m penalties and then Jacob Schuback benefited from a poor kick across goal from experienced Panther Trent Mills.

That put Glenelg 17 points in front and gave it the momentum and confidence.

Ruckman Trevor Crankston and Brad Smith took control, giving the Tigers' running players first use of the ball and enabling the visitors to apply plenty of pressure.

When the ball did go into the Panthers' forward line, it was with very little method and there was no strong focal point able to make a stand.

With the aid of the wind, the Tigers surged to a commanding 31-point advantage at the last change and had the premiership points well under control.
